
*Second Summer | February and March*

Bunuru is the hottest time of the year with little or no rain and as we know only too well, hot easterly winds.

The cooling sea breezes along the coast do much to dispel the searing heat of the day.

Noongar people lived and fished along the coast, rivers and estuaries during these months, and they feasted on freshwater and sea foods.

The flora that is prominent includes many white flowers as well as flowering gums such as the Jarrah, Marri and Ghost Gum trees in full bloom.

The Zamia plant produces huge cones in the centre of the plant with a mass of white cotton wool like substance. The seeds over this month change from green to red and fleshy – a treat for emus! The colour of Bunuru is **red** for heat.


## 5<sup>th</sup> SUNDAYS

Services will be: **9am** and **7pm**.




*I know it won't be easy, but let's pray that together we all experience a more meaningful Lent.*

It was the perfect event to lead us into our wonderful Christmas services.


