CLUB REGULATIONS

New Members: It is the responsibility of the proposer and seconder to see that a new member is introduced to other members and is advised on rules governing the conduct in the clubhouse, on the course and the dress regulations in each of these environments. If a golfer, the new member should be suitably well versed in the rules of golf to perform as marker for a fellow competitor.

Visitors: The Alice Springs Golf Club Inc (ASGC) welcomes all visitors to the club. Visitors with valid Golf Australia handicaps are encouraged to join our competitions. They are eligible to take part in Minor Competitions, but are not eligible to take part in Major Club Competitions or Board events, unless that event is an Open event. All visitors to the club, other than Temporary Members, should be properly recorded in the visitor's book by the accompanying member immediately upon arrival in the clubhouse. This is a legal requirement.

ETIQUETTE AND SLOW PLAY

Section 1 of the Rules of Golf applies. In addition, players are asked to pay particular attention to the following:

On the Tee: The player must be aware when it is their turn to play and be ready to hit. If you suspect that your ball may be lost or out of bounds, then hit a provisional ball before leaving the tee. Do not hold up play by marking or consulting your scorecard when you should be playing. Please play ready golf.

Through the Green: The order of play should be anticipated and the player ready to hit. If your ball is shorter than, or near to the distance of, a fellow player's ball that has left the fairway, then play your shot before going to assist them in their search. Please carry a bucket of sand with you and repair any divots you may find.

On the Green: Buggies and motorised carts should be placed or parked close to the route to the next tee. Please keep motorised carts a minimum of 5 metres from the green. Repair any pitch or plug marks you notice within reason and leave the green as soon as your group has completed the hole.

Bunkers: Players must smooth out the sand in bunkers, including footprints, after playing their shot and prior to leaving the bunker. Use the rakes provided and replace the rake on the floor of the bunker, facing the direction of play.

Calling Through: A match which loses its place in the field, such that there is one clear hole ahead, **MUST** call through the match behind. Matches being held up under these circumstances have a duty to the rest of the field to play through when it is safe to do so. There is no stigma attached to calling through a group because you have lost a ball, so be fair to the rest of the golfers on the course. The low marker in the group is responsible for advising the group that is seen to be slow that you are playing through, as is your right. Only play through when it is safe to do so and be sure to advise the slow group of your intentions before doing so.

Picking Up: A player who can no longer score on a hole in a particular competition, such as Stableford or Par, should pick up their ball so that play proceeds quickly.

Priority on the Course: Groupings as per the time sheet for the competition have priority. If the sheet is in groups of four players, then they have priority. However, common sense should be used if the possibility of letting a faster, smaller group through without too much inconvenience to the field exists. Representative, Championship or Matchplay play-off groups have priority over regular competition groups. All competition groups have priority over any non-competition group. A single player has no priority on the course.

CLUB COMPETITIONS

Members are reminded that many Club Championships and Honour Board events take place over a whole weekend or several weekends. If you are unable to play the complete series, please do not nominate for the event or mark your card as a possible qualifier. If you do intend to qualify and you will be available for the entire series, then mark the relevant qualifying card with a 'Q' to indicate your intention to qualify. Players who fail to mark their cards with a 'Q' will be assumed to be unavailable for the Championship or Honour Board event and will not be considered for the draw.

Scorecards: Each competitor is responsible at the end of a round of a competition for ensuring that:

- their scorecard is completed with each nine totalled and final scores placed in the top right hand corner of the card
- their scorecard is scanned through the MiClub scanner in the clubhouse and that the score provided on the screen matches the score on their card if the scores do not match, checking the card to verify the problem and correcting these issues either on the card or on the screen as appropriate
- their score is confirmed on the system
- their card is placed in the receptacle provided by the Match Committee

DO NOT rely on your partner to return your card as it is not their responsibility. Incorrectly marked or unsigned cards will be dealt with in accordance with the Rules of Golf. Players failing to return cards for a competition they have entered will have their handicaps adjusted as per the Golf Australia handicapping rules.

Saturday Competitions: Saturday competitions will normally be either Single Stroke or Single Stableford, except as required for Championship events or Championship qualifying events. Starts will be from either the first tee, or the first and tenth tees, as indicated on the time sheet.

Sunday Competitions: Starts will be from the first tee only, unless sufficient numbers in the starting field warrant additional starts from the tenth tee.

Trade Days: Trade day groups have right of way on the active 9 holes reserved for the day, unless there are sufficient numbers to warrant use of the entire course. In most cases, starts will be shotgun starts and coordinated through the pro-shop prior to the day of the event. Members not playing in the Trade Day are asked to either use the other 9 holes for practice or to observe the closure of the course for the event, whichever is the case.

Match Play Competitions: There are a number of major events in the calendar that encompass Matchplay. To ensure that it is a good day on the course for all concerned we ask that :

- Players not in the matchplay remember that matchplay has right of way on the course and participants should be 'let through' as soon as reasonably possible.
- Players participating in the matchplay are asked to show consideration for their fellow members and not play through without first checking with the group they are passing.

Other Competitions: Any other official club competition will have the right of way on the day of that competition and on that part of the course being used for that competition.

The Season: The season shall run from the first weekend in March until the end of October each year.

MATCH COMMITTEE RULES

All competitions are under the management of the Match Committee. The Rules of Golf, as approved and amended from time to time by R&A Rules Limited will apply, together with such Local Rules as may be deemed appropriate from time to time.

Protests are to be made to the Match Committee before the close of competition, or as soon as possible after entering the clubhouse after completion of the player's round.

The Match Committee reserves the right to vary the conditions of play of any event, or to alter the program as it deems appropriate at any time. Practice is restricted to the designated practice areas.

Slow play will not be tolerated. The Match Committee reserves the right to enforce penalties as per the Rules of Golf or Local Rules effective at the time. Groups are encouraged to keep up with the group in front or call other groups through to fill vacant fairways. Daily competitions close 15 minutes after the last player leaves the 9th or 18th green. All cards must be returned by this time.

COUNTBACK SYSTEM

In the event of a tie for 18-hole events, the best score on the last 9 holes shall be used to determine the winner and place getters. If a tie still exists, the last 6 holes shall be used, then the last 3, and then hole by hole working backwards from the 18th.

In events longer than 18 holes, the score for the last 18 holes shall be used, then as per the procedure for 18-hole events.

For 9-hole events, the last 6 holes, then the last 3 holes and then hole by hole from the last shall be used.

In the event that scores are still tied after the above, then the tie shall stand.

PRESENTATION OF TROPHIES

Presentation of trophies and prizes for all weekend competitions shall take place immediately after the round once results have been completed, unless circumstances dictate otherwise.

Presentation of major club championship events shall take place on a designated Presentation Day, immediately after the Presentation Day Cup Event.

EAGLES' NEST

The Eagles' Nest shall be awarded for eagles gained on Par 4s and albatrosses gained on Par 4s and Par 5s in singles events only, provided the event is played off the Blue (Men's) or Red (Women's) tees. The Eagles' Nest shall start at 6 balls and grow at the rate of 1 ball per singles competition thereafter until won, at which point it will be reset to 6 balls. In the event of multiple qualifying eagles in the one competition round, the Eagle's Nest shall be shared evenly among the eagles gained. The Eagle's Nest will be awarded as soon as possible following the eagle.

Eagles gained on Par 5s, in singles events only, shall be awarded 2 balls per eagle.

HOLE IN ONE

Hole in One awards and recognition will be awarded only for singles events played off the Blue, White and Red (Men's) or Red (Women's) tees. Members will have their names added to the Hole in One Honour Board and will receive a Hole in One trophy, as well as any other awards provided by our valued sponsors at the time. Hole in Ones on Par 3s are not eligible for the Eagle's Nest. Members gaining Hole in Ones during mid-week 9-hole competitions will have their names added to the Honour Boards appropriate to the competition.

BEST OFF STICK

In each Single Stroke event, the best off the stick shall be awarded 2 balls.

HANDICAPPING

Men: To obtain a Golf Australia handicap, a player must submit to the club handicapper three (3) cards for rounds played over 9 or 18 holes. At least one of these cards must be recorded during an official Alice Springs competition. Any cards returned for non-competition rounds must be attested by a golfer affiliated directly or indirectly with a State Association of Golf Australia. The maximum Golf Australia handicap is 36 for men and 45 for women

Male members will be graded as per Golf Australia rules, as follows:

'A' Grade	Up to and including handicap 12
'B' Grade	Handicap 13 to 19 inclusive
'C' Grade	Handicap 20 to 36 inclusive

Female members will be graded as per Golf Australia rules, as follows:

'A' Grade	Up to and including handicap 18
'B' Grade	Handicap 19 to 29 inclusive
'C' Grade	Handicap 30 to 45 inclusive

For Club Competitions, the Match Committee reserves the right to adjust the handicap grade categories to suit the size of the field or the competition being played.

The Match Committee reserves the right to limit the maximum handicap for any competition.

GENERAL

Practice Rounds: Members wishing to practise on the course **MUST** check with the pro-shop to ensure they will not interfere with any other competition or organised event in progress at the time. Practice on the course should be with ONE ball only.

Dress Rules: Members and their guests are expected to present themselves neatly and suitably attired both on the course and in the Clubhouse. Persons not suitably attired will be asked to leave the premises on the authority of a member of staff or the Management Committee. It is the responsibility of a member to ensure that their guest is aware of the dress rules and suitably attired.

All clothing, including footwear and hats, must be clean, neat and tidy and worn in the appropriate manner and not display offensive slogans or motifs. Boxer shorts, tank tops or singlets for men are not permitted. The course is a SOFT SPIKES only course and steel or hard spikes are not permitted on the course or any club environs.

Motorised Carts: The use of motorised carts is permitted for all ASGC events. In order for private motorised carts to be used on the ASGC environs, the following conditions apply:

The cart owner or operator must be a financial member of the ASGC.

Permission for use of the cart on the course, whether in competition or not, must be obtained from the club. The use of a private cart on the course subject to a levy.

The cart must be registered as soon as possible, in writing, with the ASGC, including details of the make, model and registration number.

ALICE SPRINGS GOLF CLUB TROPHIES & EVENTS

Eclectic: The eclectic shall be run during the season on all Single Stroke, Stableford and Par (including Bisque) events only, in which all members are eligible to participate. The objective is to collect the lowest possible score on each hole during the course of the season. Players are to mark their scorecard with an 'E' and circle on their scorecards the holes they wish entered on the eclectic sheet. Payment for participation must be made to the Pro-shop at the time of collection of the first scorecard for the season's eclectic. Prizes are awarded for both Gross and Nett results in separate men's and women's competitions.

Top Gun: Top Gun will run during the season on all Single Stroke and Single Stableford ASGC events. All members are eligible to participate. At the end of the season the 19 players in one division with the best nett scores, will play off in a shoot-out format for the cash kitty.

Captains' and Sponsors' (D.B. Neck and Images Hair & Beauty) Trophies: The Captains' and Sponsors' trophies are played for over 5 nominated stroke rounds during the season. The Captains' trophies are awarded to the lowest aggregate Gross score over the best 3 of the 5 nominated rounds. The Sponsors' trophies are awarded to the lowest aggregate Nett score over the best 3 of the 5 nominated rounds. The D.B. Neck Trophy will be presented to the men's Nett winner and the Images Hair & Beauty Centre Trophy will be presented to the women's Nett winner.

Monthly Medal: The monthly medal is awarded to the player with the best Nett score during the nominated stroke round each month.

Guzzler's Cup and Goblet: The Guzzler's Cup is awarded to the men's monthly medal winner and the Guzzler's Goblet is awarded to the women's monthly medal winner. The winners hold the Cup and Goblet until the next monthly medal. The current holders may ask any member to purchase a drink in the Cup or Goblet of the holders' choice of beverage at any time. If any member is asked twice by the holder, then the holder shall fill the member's glass instead.

Medal of Medallists: The winners of the previous 12 monthly medals (November to October) shall play off for the Medal of Medallists in a Single Stroke round in late October or early November. The winner of the Medal of Medallists shall be the medallist with the lowest Nett score in the playoff round.

Tiger Challenge: Tiger Challenge is a stroke round with challenging tee and pin placements. In addition to the usual daily competition prizes there will be additional prizes awarded to any player who plays under their handicap. There will be three rounds of Tiger Challenge during the season and the player who scores the best two of three nett scores will be awarded a trophy on presentation day.

Patron's Trophy: The Patron's Trophy is awarded to the best stroke aggregate gross 72-hole score during the season. The aggregate is based on a player's best four single stroke gross scores during the season.

The Clark–Armstead Cup (The Ashes/Cromwell Challenge): The Clark-Armstead Cup is named in honour of the former Captains of the Alice Springs and Cromwell (NZ) Golf Clubs who initiated the annual challenge match between the clubs in 1965. The Cup contains the ashes of one of each of their woods. The Ashes are played for in September/October each year with the respective members playing their own courses, except when one club

visits the other. The winning club is decided by the aggregate of the best 6 men's Stableford scores in division 1 and 2, and the best 6 women's Stableford scores. The Cup is on display at the winning club until the other club wins.

Sponsors Team Matchplay: This competition will consist of six teams that play each other over five rounds during the season. Team points will be awarded – 2 points for a win and 1 point for a halved match. The team with the highest accumulated points at the end of the season will have their name inscribed on the perpetual trophy and each player of the team will be awarded a trophy/medal at Presentation Day.

4BBB (4 Ball Better Ball) Handicap Matchplay: This is a match between two teams of two partners. Each partner plays the hole and the best Nett score of each partnership is used to decide the hole. Handicaps are determined by reducing lowest handicapped player to scratch and reducing all other players by the same amount. The Matchplay index is used to determine where the strokes are taken. A 4BBB Stableford event is used to determine the qualifiers. The top 8 men's and women's pairs qualify for the matchplay finals. The winners shall receive trophies and/or any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Singles Handicap Matchplay: As previous, but played on an individual basis. A Stroke round to determine qualifiers is held before the event. The top 8 men's and women's Nett scores qualify for the matchplay finals. The winners shall receive trophies and/or any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Foursomes Championship: Foursomes is played with a partner, with each partner hitting alternate shots. The championship will be played over one day. The format is 36 holes for men and 27 holes for women by invitation partners and drawn opponents. There are separate men's and women's Championships. The Gross and Nett winners shall receive trophies and/or any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Mixed Foursomes Championship: This is a Foursomes competition for mixed gender teams. The championship is

played over 36 holes and 2 days by invitation partners and drawn opponents. The Gross and Nett winners shall receive trophies and/or any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Strokeplay Championship: There will be a single men's and women's Strokeplay Champion determined by the aggregate gross score of four consecutive 18 hole stroke rounds played over two weekends. The runners up will be determined by the next best aggregate gross score. A Gross Champion and runner-up will also be determined in B and C Grades. A single Nett winner will also be determined in each grade. All members automatically qualify for the Championship until such time as they do not complete one of the Championship rounds. In the event of a tie after the second round for the Strokeplay Championship, the tied players shall play such playoff holes as determined by the Match Committee. In the event of ties in the Grade and Nett Championships, the winners shall be determined by countback. The Strokeplay Champion, Grade Gross winners, Grade Gross runners up and the Grade Nett winners shall receive trophies and any applicable prizes from sponsors. Prizes will be awarded as per the daily ball rundown for daily Nett results.

Club Championship: The contestants for this championship will qualify over two nominated Single Stroke rounds conducted on a single weekend. The top 8 gross Stroke scores in each grade (A, B, C) will qualify for the matchplay playoffs. The matchplay playoffs will be held over the next weekend and the following Saturday. The quarter- and semi-finals matches will be 18 holes, or as many holes as required until a winner is decided. In the event that the match is square after 18 holes, the players will continue on from the 1st tee and play such holes as required to determine a winner. The finals shall be played over 36 holes, or as many holes as required until a winner is decided. In the event that the match is square after 36 holes, the players will continue on from the 1st tee and play such holes as required to determine a winner. The winners shall receive trophies and any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Senior's Handicap Event: This is run in conjunction with the Club Strokeplay Championship. To be eligible, players must be aged 50 or older as of the first day of the competition. Players must mark their card with an 'S'. The Gross and Nett winners shall receive any applicable prizes from sponsors.

Junior Strokeplay Event: This will be a 36 hole event run in conjunction with the Club Strokeplay Championships. Rounds 1 and 2 scores will be used to determine Junior Champions. To be eligible, players must be aged less than 18 as of the first day of the competition. The Gross and Nett winners shall receive a trophy and/or any applicable prizes from sponsors. A separate boy's and girl's champion will be decided where possible. The overall Gross champion will have their name added to the appropriate Honour Board.

Other Competition Formats: The rules for other competition formats are in the Pro Shop and will be displayed for the appropriate event.

Disputes: Please carry a Rule Book with you at all times and resolve any disputes before you proceed to the next stroke or hole. If necessary, play a second ball and resolve the dispute with a member of the Match Committee as soon as possible after the completion of the round. Remember, penalties apply for proceeding to the next hole or playing the next stroke if you have not rectified an error which has occurred. Golf is one of the last remaining HONEST sports.

Complaints: All complaints must be made in writing to the General Manager. Under no circumstances shall an employee of the club be admonished or reprimanded by a member. Matters pertaining to golf or golf competitions should be addressed to the Captains, with a "for information" copy to the General Manager.

Insurance: Members should note that the club does not provide insurance cover in respect of members' property (including contents of the buggy room or lockers). MEMBERS

ARE ADVISED TO COVER THEIR OWN CONTINGENCIES ON THEIR OWN ACCOUNT.

Damage to Adjoining Property: Members are requested to report to the General Manager, as soon as possible, any apparent or possible damage to adjoining property or passing vehicles caused by golf balls.

Care of the Course:

- Please carry a full sand bucket with you at all times and repair any divots you may cause or encounter.
- Please repair any pitch or plug marks on the green that you may cause or encounter.
- Please rake any marks you may leave in the bunkers.
- If you are putting the flagstick on the green, please do so in a way that no damage is caused to the green or putting surface.
- Please keep motorised carts at least 10 metres or outside the broken blue line from the putting surface.
