

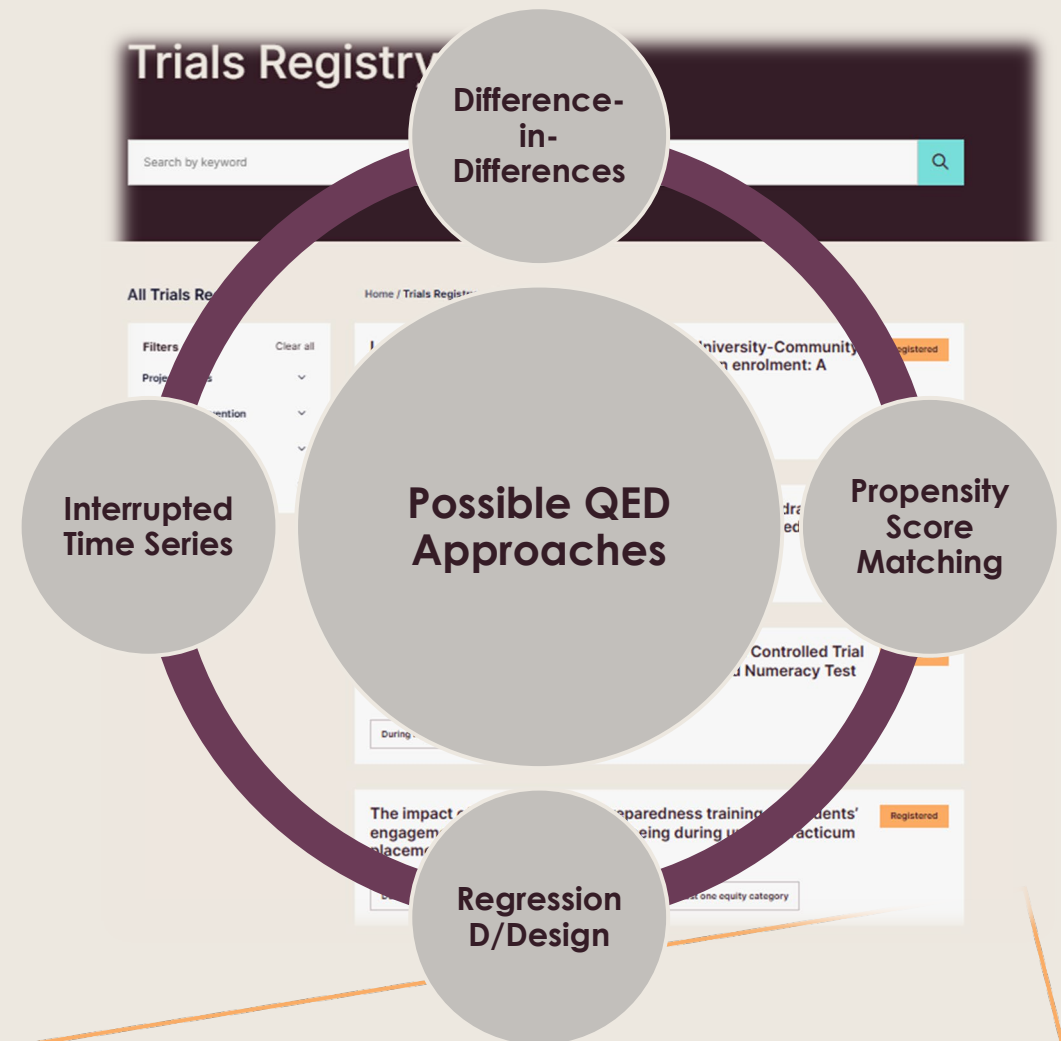




1. What is a QED?

- ▶ ACSES has funded several **randomised control trials**. These are available on the [ACSES Trials Registry](#).
- ▶ But random allocation is not always possible or practical.
- ▶ **QED** allow us to use existing datasets to understand the impact of an initiative.



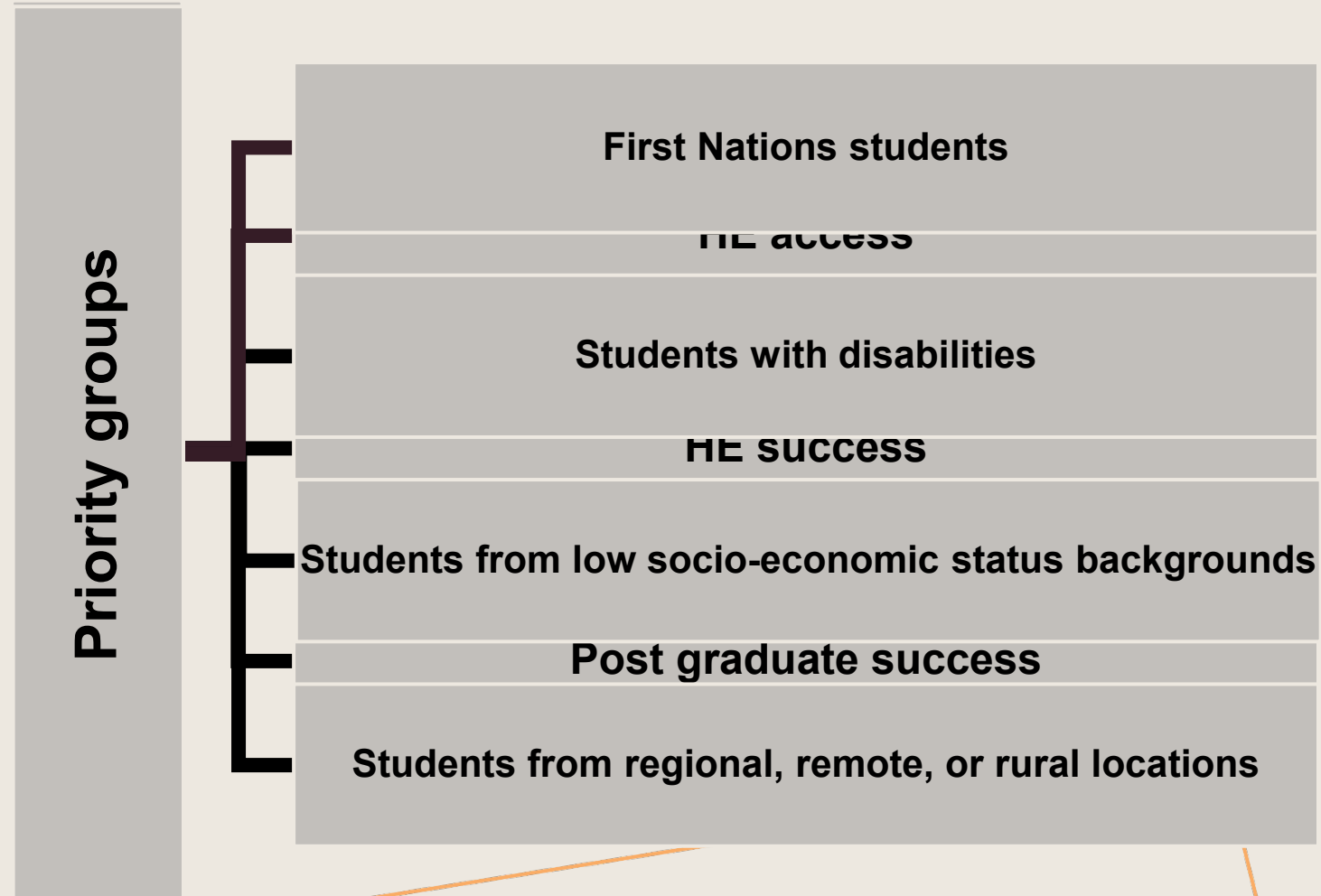
2. Eligibility

- ▶ The project must be led by a Table A institution.
 - ▶ Other institutions or organisations may be included as collaborators.
 - ▶ Applicants can be listed on more than one proposal.
 - ▶ NOTE: Funding for more than one project will only occur in exceptional circumstances.
-

3. Priority groups & target outcomes

The project should:

- a. Focus on at least one of the following priority groups.
- b. Measure one or more of the following higher education outcomes



4. Funding available

Maximum funding available per project is \$150,000.

Three stage application process is as follows:



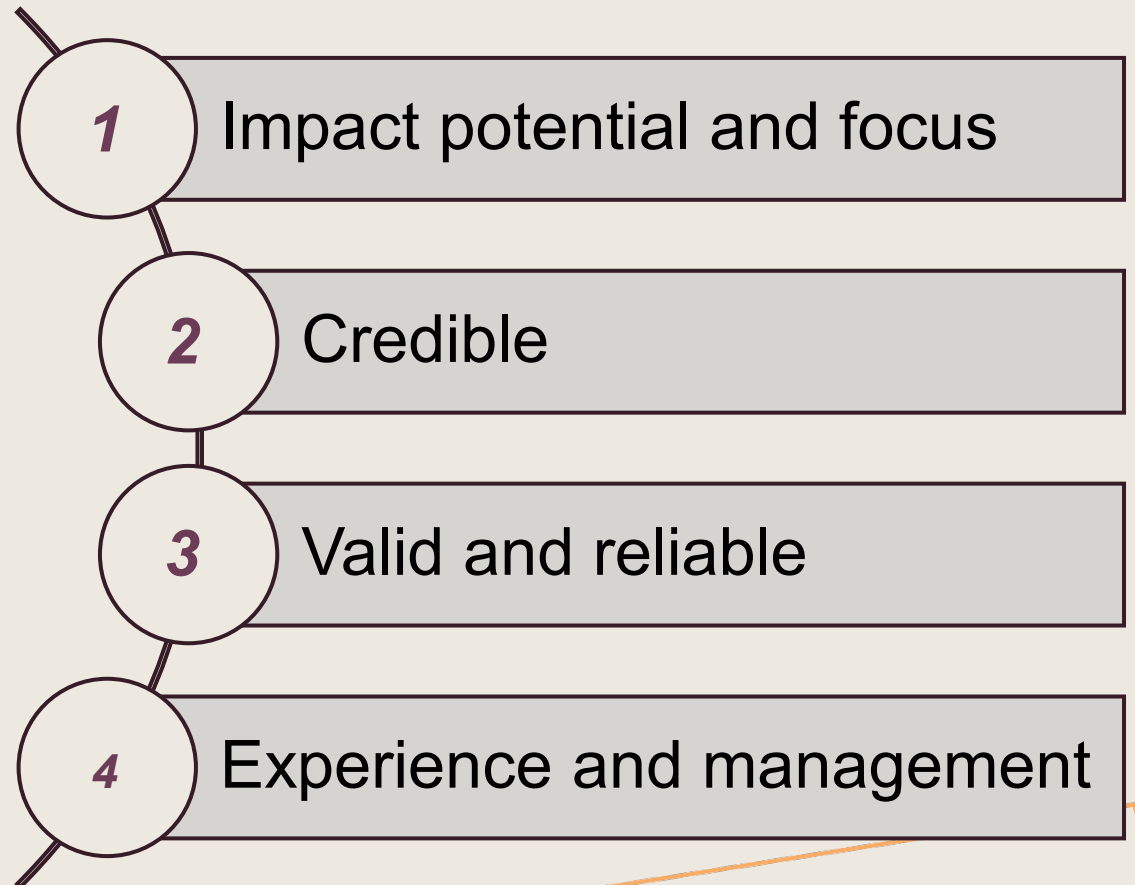
STAGE 1 ACSES staff review the Proposals

STAGE 2 *Equity Frontiers Grants Committee* assessment

STAGE 3 Final determination

31 July 2025

Funding announcement

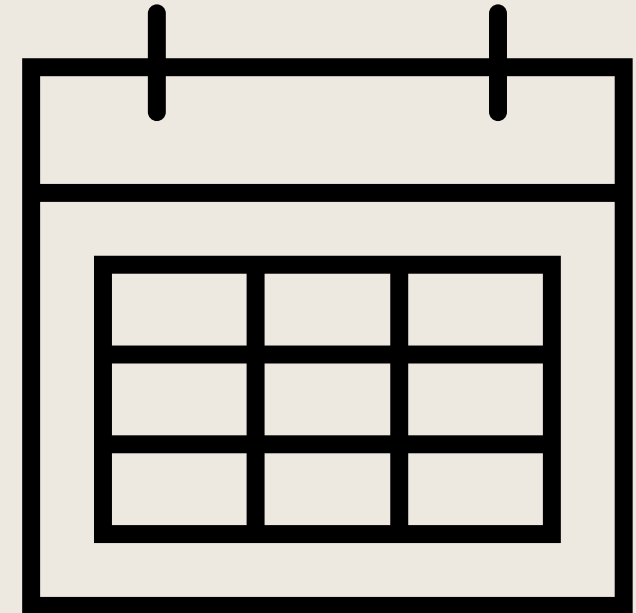
By 29 August 2025

Projects commence

By 3 November 2025

Projects conclude

By 26 June 2027
