Support for SHINE's educational programs

SHINE's educational programs, including Shine, Shimmer, and the new Emerging Women initiative, will be supported with \$150,000 over three years by MEPAU and Beach Energy.

The educational programs aim to help at-risk students stay engaged in education, build confidence, and develop life and employment skills. The Emerging Women program helps young women by offering mentoring, training, and support to continue studying or find a job. This partnership will support over 140 young women each year to build better futures in the Mid West.

Safeguarding Native Species

The House and Home: Safeguarding Native Species five-year project will receive \$650,000 from MEPAU and Beach Energy.

The Northern Agricultural Catchments Council Natural Resource Management (NACC NRM) project will focus on protecting threatened plants, restoring habitats for Carnaby's Cockatoo, managing pests, and engaging with the community.

NACC NRM CEO Katherine Allen said, "NACC NRM is pleased to partner with MEPAU and Beach Energy, to deliver improved outcomes for threatened flora and fauna in the Mid West. Landcare is a long game, and our shared commitment to this five-year project reflects that focus."
