Deep barriers safely recovered in Waitsia wells

MEPAU's Drilling and Completions team have successfully and safely recovered deep-set barriers in eight Waitsia Development wells.

The work was completed riglessly using wireline operations, highlighting the team's ability to carry out complex downhole tasks efficiently, while maintaining a strong focus on safety and well integrity. This is a key milestone in preparing the wells for the upcoming production phase.

As part of our ongoing decommissioning program, the team has also removed wellheads and completed site clean up at ten legacy wells — seven Operated by MEPAU and three JV wells Operated by Beach Energy at the Beharra Springs Gas Field.
