# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT & CEO

It is with great pleasure that we present the 2021/22 Surf Life Saving WA Annual Report and highlight some of the past year's achievements.

As an organisation, we have continued to invest in our four operational pillars: Lifesaving, Training & Education, Youth & Nippers, and Surf Sports, and it is pleasing to report achievements across each of these areas.

Firstly, to our members, whose shared commitment to this wonderful movement that is Surf Life Saving and whose contributions continue to impact and enrich the communities in which they serve, on behalf of all WA beachgoers, we extend our heartfelt thanks for your service.

Over the past season across WA, our 5,860 volunteer surf lifesavers performed more than 380 rescues, 17,800 preventative actions and 1,290 first aid treatments – a service to the WA community that is immeasurable.

Despite some ongoing interruptions due to COVID-related restrictions, we are delighted to have experienced further growth in our membership, closing the year with more than 24,850 members – our biggest year ever.

This growth is evident across numerous areas, including our Woodside Nippers, with more than 8,860 across WA. This includes significant growth in the U13 age group through both retention and attraction of new members.

We saw increased participation in Nipper sports, hosting our largest ever Little Nippers' Championships, and we introduced the Nipper Regional Championships, comprised of four events, to great success.

We strongly believe this increased participation in Nipper sports assists growth in our upper Nipper age groups and youth.

A focus on delivering a quality Youth Program is also reaping the rewards as we experience increased engagement across these age groups.

Last season 34 members achieved their Gold Level in our Youth Leaders Program, having accumulated more than 230 hours each across the lifesaving, sport and training pillars – an enormous accomplishment.

Unfortunately, we did have to postpone this year's Nipper & Youth Awards, but we look forward to recognising the achievements of these members at the rescheduled ceremony in October.

The second season of our Rookie Lifeguard Program was again fully subscribed, as were our youth camps, despite increasing their capacity. This is all excellent news for the future of our movement.

Surf Sports participation has continued to be strong, with excellent numbers contesting the Championship events. With a large increase in surf boat numbers, it was great to see success at The Aussies with a silver in the open women.

While COVID restrictions interrupted the delivery of some events, including the move for Aussies back to the Gold Coast, we look forward to welcoming surf lifesavers across Australia to WA in 2023.

In training, thanks to the hard work of our volunteer trainers and assessors, we have delivered over 3,000 awards to members this past season. We also provided free accredited first aid training to over 500 members.

Despite interruptions, we are seeing progress with our new Development Centre in Margaret River, with substantial site works completed. We anticipate it will be ready for use early in 2023, providing exciting opportunities for our clubs and members to utilise these facilities.

Finally, we take this opportunity to recognise those who share in our mission and make the achievements outlined in this report possible. The WA Government, our corporate partners, fellow board members and staff, and our Club Presidents, we thank you for your commitment to helping us save lives and build great communities here in WA.

### Christopher Brien ESM - Esperance Goldfields Surf Life Saving Club

Chris has given an exceptional 30 years of service to Surf Life Saving in Western Australia, playing a pivotal role in the Esperance region in frontline operations and club management.

Receiving his bronze medallion at Scarborough in 1991, Chris was instrumental in establishing the Esperance Goldfields SLSC, where he served as President for ten years.

He established the local Jet Ski Emergency Response Team and has coordinated that team since 2007. In 2011, he was the inaugural winner of the Support Operations Volunteer of the Year. Chris is also a qualified trainer and assessor.

In 2014 Chris was elected to the Surf Life Saving WA Board and continues to serve on the Board today. He is Chair of Surf Life Saving WA's Strategic Committee and has been integral in shaping the organisation's strategic direction.

At the forefront of the coordination of Marine Search and Rescue activity in the Great Southern region, he has been awarded a citation of appreciation from the WA Police for his leadership during search and rescue missions, and in the 2022 Queens Birthday Honours was recognised with the Emergency Services Medal.

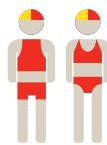

SLSWA, through our clubs, coordinates volunteer surf life saving patrols at many of Western Australia's most popular accessible beaches during the season. The lifesaving services provided are essential to local community safety, even more so in recent seasons where we have experienced ongoing COVID-19 travel restrictions.

Our selfless and highly skilled volunteers often put themselves in hazardous situations to perform rescues when beachgoers get into trouble, remaining vigilant and available despite the COVID restrictions. While primarily responsible for protecting the lives of people in the water, they also play an active role in preventing potentially life-threatening scenarios and are regularly called upon to administer first aid both on and off the beach.

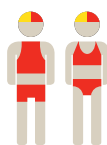

Supported by the Government of Western Australia and partnered by Westpac, our Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter Service (WLRH) continues to deliver important outcomes in maintaining the confidence of WA's beach users.

SLSWA operates two helicopters with coverage along the metropolitan and south west coast. Based out of Rous Head, Fremantle, the metro service patrols from Yanchep in the north to Port Bouvard in the south and Rottnest Island in the west. The south west service is based out of Busselton Margaret River Airport and provides coverage over popular coastal destinations between Bunbury and Hamelin Bay.

The highly trained SLSWA crews conduct coastal surveillance patrols on the lookout for marine life, including sharks, people in distress, incidents on beaches, potential threats including rip currents, and search and rescue taskings.

The 2021/22 season saw an 11% increase in the number of shark sighting events and a 140% increase in tasking requests for search and rescue.

## MISSING SWIMMER FOUND NORTH OF YALLINGUP BEACH

On Thursday, 23 December 2021, at approximately 1100HRS, the Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter (WLRH) was completing the return leg of a planned surveillance route when, upon arrival to Yallingup Beach, contact was made by Yallingup Lifeguards via radio, seeking assistance to locate a suspected missing swimmer.

Yallingup Lifeguards had observed the male swimmer enter the water and begin swimming north with what appeared to be a yellow float in tow. His belongings were left on the beach. At the time, there were approximately 90 people in the water, including 30 craft users, and 100 people on the beach.

Crew onboard the WLRH conducted an initial anticlockwise orbit of Yallingup Beach to reposition themselves with the

swimmer's last known location. This orbit also helped confirm that the swimmer did not travel south. Following a search of the swimmer's "exit corridor", the WLRH then tracked north, investigating points of interest along the way.

Within 15 minutes of the initial request by Yallingup Lifeguards, the WLRH located a person on an inshore reef approximately 1.5km north of Yallingup Beach. The swimmer matched the description of the missing swimming, which was confirmed by sharing live imagery with Yallingup Lifeguards.

The interoperability between the WLRH and Yallingup Lifeguards, including clear and ongoing radio communication, demonstrated the importance of a tiered risk management model for coastal safety.

As a localised surveillance initiative, Drone Patrol makes a vital contribution to a club's suite of available surf lifesaving equipment and skill sets. Supplementing the broader regional capabilities of our Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter Service, the addition of drones as surveillance and intelligence gathering tools also provides an additional member pathway and opportunity for participation.

The 2021/22 season saw a focus on developing sustainability in the Program, which is surrounded by a heavy compliance environment and fast-changing technology. Achievements from the season include:

- 127 patrols conducted
- 305 hours of localised aerial surveillance delivered
- 15 new operators completed training and were endorsed to operate a drone, taking the total number of endorsed operators to 75
- 12 active endorsed clubs
- During the abalone season, two patrol locations were provided with support from Drone Patrol

Jet Ski services are an integral element of SLSWA's lifesaving services, providing an additional

resource for clubs to deliver effective lifesaving patrols and provide support to external agencies such as the WA Water Police. This is achieved through emergency response actions and search and rescue taskings, which facilitates additional training and pathway opportunities for members.

During this season, more than 2,200 hours of on-water time were delivered by Clubs and members. This included mobilisation of Support Operations Groups to provide an average of 15 Jet Skis and crews during the four one-hour abalone patrols during the 2021/22 season.

In addition, the Jet Ski Emergency Response Teams were tasked to support 13 search and rescue missions spanning Kalbarri to Esperance.

### 13SURF AND ST JOHN AMBULANCE FIRST RESPONDER PROGRAM

13SURF is an emergency services hotline number handled by SurfCom. The hotline is vital in providing a direct communication link for external emergency management agencies to Surf Life Saving's first response resources or to request the tasking of relevant lifesaving services to assist during coastal emergencies. External agencies that regularly utilise 13SURF include St John Ambulance and the WA Police, in particular, the Water Police Specialist Unit.

This season, 132 calls were received via 13SURF seeking assistance from Surf Life Saving resources to respond to active incidents.

As the State Operations Centre, SurfCom's role is to support operational communications and coordination for multiple agencies, including the WA Police, St John Ambulance, Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development's Shark Response Unit and various local government ranger services.

Supporting activities include 13SURF tasking, operational asset tracking and distress monitoring, incident logging and recording, monitoring of the Emergency Rescue Communications Network, call taking and dispatching, and capturing and recording operational data including chronological steps involved in incident management.

SurfCom Controllers also communicate real-time beach safety messaging to the public, including notification of beach closures, shark sightings and general coastal safety advice, via Twitter and BeachSAFE.org.au

### CAPITAL EQUIPMENT SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Capital Equipment Support Program, delivered by the WA Government through the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, completed its fourth year in a five-year program. This support, which demonstrates strong recognition of the value of SLSWA's services to community safety, ensures clubs have access to costly rescue-ready equipment, meaning they can focus on meeting the recurrent operational expenses without the concern of the significant initial capital cost.

In 2021/22, the Grant facilitated clubs receiving side-by-side all-terrain vehicles, Inflatable Rescue Boat hulls, outboard engines, and Jet Skis.

Recreational abalone fishing in WA's West Coast Zone is the world's shortest licenced fishing period, with a maximum of five one-hour sessions each summer. Despite the shortness of the season, which is primarily influenced by sustainable management of abalone stock, it is statistically one of Australia's most dangerous coastal aquatic recreational activities.

With around 16,000 recreational licences issued each year, the hugely popular activity sees fishers descend upon the inshore reef around the metropolitan area during the one-hour fishing periods. While outside of the core beach safety services provided by our clubs and members, the results demonstrate that Surf Life Saving's involvement is the single most significant difference in a fisher going home alive with their prized catch.

In 2021/22, four sessions were delivered between December and February, and with favourable conditions and high levels of lifesaving resources, no lives were lost while participating in abalone fishing.

### RECREATIONAL FISHING INITIATIVES FUND

2021/22 was the final year of a 3-year grant received through the WA Government's Recreational Fishing Initiative Fund

to support SLSWA and our clubs' involvement in critical incident prevention and rescue services during abalone fishing sessions.

Through the assistance of the Grant, there was a focus on supporting participating clubs and volunteers to ensure every fishing session was appropriately resourced to enable the implementation of initiatives across the key areas of prevention, rescue, education, research, and regulation.

This included delivery of the SLSWA-developed advanced lifesaving training courses focusing on rock and reef rescue techniques, including water entries from rock/reef outcrops, Jet Ski crew procedures and rescue techniques that included the use of rescue rope throw bags.

Over the last three years, thanks to the efforts of our volunteer surf lifesavers, we have seen drowning incidents and rescue activity reduce. All participating members are to be commended for their unwavering commitment to protecting users of our coastline.

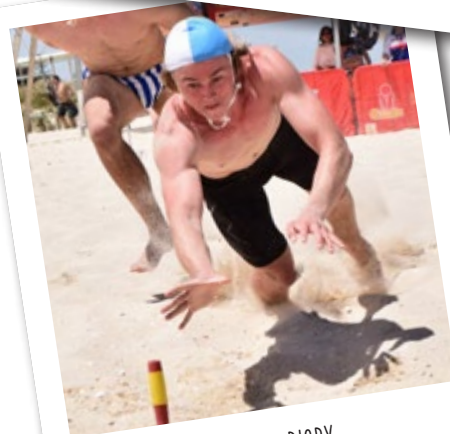

### Simon Huitenga - City of Perth Surf Life Saving Club

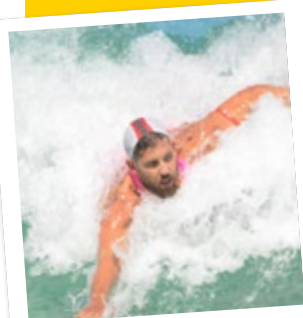
Simon is an elite competitor, most renowned for his surf swimming acumen, winning his first individual WA Open title in 2008.

Over his career, Simon took out nine WA Open Surf Race titles, two Open Ironman, an Open Belt Race and four Restricted Surf Race titles, plus many team gold medals.

His success extended to the Australian Championships, where he won a gold medal in the U/17 Surf Race and the over 24 Restricted Surf Race, three silver medals in the U19 Surf Race, Open Restricted Surf Race and Open Male Surf Race, and two bronze medals in the Open Surf Race and 2km Elite Male Ocean Swim.

He represented WA as a member of several of the Western Suns State Teams, with his multi-discipline skills highly regarded.

Simon's consistent and outstanding performances as an elite athlete make him a worthy inductee to the Surf Life Saving WA Sporting Hall of Fame.



## KEY EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

### NIPPER SPORT

A highlight of the season has been the strong growth in surf sports competition by our Nippers. In February, we hosted our largest ever **Little Nippers' Championships** with more than 560 competitors, while nearly 1,000 took on the **SunSmart WA Championships** in March.

Also new to the calendar was the **Nipper Regional Championships**, a series of four events held in Geraldton, Albany, Secret Harbour and Bunbury, providing more competitive opportunities for our Nippers and an additional qualification pathway to our WA championships.

We strongly believe this increased participation in Nipper sports has assisted the growth of the upper Nipper age groups and youth.



### SUNSMART WA SURF LEAGUE

The SunSmart WA Surf League continues to be a highlight of the event calendar and, with several format changes implemented last season, has continued to grow.

Despite the disappointing cancellation of one round due to COVID restrictions, we were able to successfully deliver two rounds of the series, which experienced a huge 66% increase in competitor numbers.

As a new initiative, the Open and Youth events were held concurrently in a single arena, adding greatly to the spectator experience, which included a live stream of Round 1 from North Cottesloe beach.

### WESTERN SUNS STATE TEAMS



With COVID-related restrictions impacting the ability to travel to the east coast and hampering the delivery of multiple events, including many from which Western Suns teams' selection would normally be made, no Western Suns teams were named for the 2021/22 season.

### THE AUSSIES

The call to change venue from Western Australia to Queensland late in 2021 was disappointing but deemed to be in the best interests of all athletes and the event.

WA had 160 athletes who made the journey to the Gold Coast to compete, achieving great results, bringing home nine gold, seven silver and nine bronze medals across the Youth, Masters and Open competitions - a fantastic effort and end to the season.

## SUNSMART WA SURF LIFE SAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Whilst earlier in the season, the SunSmart WA Pool Rescue Championships and WA Board Riding Championships were impacted due to COVID restrictions coming into place, fortunately, this year's SunSmart WA Surf Life Saving Championships were able to proceed without incident.

### SunSmart WA Pool Rescue Championships

Despite a disappointing early finish with COVID-related restrictions forcing the cancellation of the second day's relay events, there was still plenty of action-packed racing in the pool!

Sorrento was crowned 2021 Champion Club, finishing with a total of 421 points ahead of defending champions Trigg Island in 2nd with 308 points, while Secret Harbour rounded out the podium in 3rd with 258 points

### SunSmart WA Surf Life Saving Championships - Masters

The SunSmart WA Masters Championships saw almost 400 masters competitors go head-to-head at Trigg Beach in near-perfect conditions. North Cottesloe was crowned Champion Masters Club for 2022 with Mullaloo coming in second, closely followed by Sorrento in third.

### SunSmart WA Country Championships

Over 200 competitors from 10 regional clubs converged on Trigg Beach to contest the 2022 SunSmart WA Country Championships.

City of Bunbury once again showed up in force, claiming an amazing 28th consecutive Country Championships title, with standout performances from their athletes across all age categories giving them an unsurpassable lead – what an incredible feat! The Handicap Trophy went to joint winners, Esperance Goldfields and Port Bouvard.

### SunSmart WA Little Nippers Surf Life Saving Championships

We continued to see growth in our youngest surf sports competitors hosting our largest ever Little Nippers

Championships, as more than 560 of our U8-U9 Nippers descended onto the sands of Sorrento Beach. Twenty-two clubs were represented as competitors took on the beach flags, beach sprints, board race and surf race. While the competition was fierce amongst our young athletes, the camaraderie and sportsmanship were just as strong as they cheered on clubmates.

### SunSmart WA Surf Life Saving Championships - Nippers

Over 900 nippers from 26 clubs battled it out over three days at Scarborough Beach in the final of our championship series, which wrapped up a massive summer of surf sports. Met with some of the largest conditions we've seen in many years, the skills and courage shown by our Nippers were outstanding.

Sorrento's consistency across the board claimed them the title of Champion Nipper Club for their second consecutive year; North Cottesloe took second and the Handicap Trophy, which recognises the most improved club, while Trigg Island rounded out the podium in third.

### SunSmart WA Surf Life Saving Championships - Youth/Open

The highly anticipated 2022 Championships saw over 1,000 of WA's best surf sports athletes from 21 clubs come together for some fierce competition at Scarborough Beach. Two-time Bernie Kelly Medallist Will Savage (Trigg Island) produced the standout performance of the weekend, taking home 12 gold medals and two bronze. Ultimately, Trigg Island proved too strong, claiming 2022 Champion Club for another consecutive year as well as 2022 Champion Youth Club with Cottesloe securing the Handicap Trophy.

### WA IRB Racing Championships

Mullaloo again dominated IRB Racing with their fifth straight overall win in the championships, with Scarborough finishing second and Fremantle taking third.

Stormy conditions loomed over the event, but the wet weather was met with some great racing from the nine clubs competing, as well as a 23% increase in competitor numbers.

## WOODSIDE NIPPERS

The 2021/22 season saw continued growth in our Woodside Nippers Program, with Nippers up by 2.5% to 8,863 state-wide. Regionally, Nipper membership in the south west grew by nearly 4%, matching the growth in metropolitan clubs.

Once again, courtesy of our naming rights partner Woodside Energy, every Nipper received a free uniform pack, including a high-vis safety rash vest, skull cap, sling sack and a wide-brim sunhat. Clubs also received their annual partnership payment to assist them in delivering the Program.

At the conclusion of the 2021/22 season, we surveyed Nipper parents to gauge their thoughts on the Program. The results were very pleasing, showing that:

- 98% of parents believed their child had developed a new skill or improved an existing skill during the season
- 95% of parents believed their child increased their physical well-being through their involvement in the Program
- 97% of parents said their child enjoyed the Woodside Nippers sessions
- Over 96% of parents were either satisfied or very satisfied with the overall experience of the Woodside Nippers Program

## YOUTH PROGRAM

Surf Life Saving WA's Youth Program provides a range of suggested activities, team-building games and workshops across lifesaving, training, surf sports and leadership. These are designed to engage and develop our youth members and give some structure to clubs' Sunday morning programs.

Although not a requirement, it is highly recommended that clubs select sections of the Program that suit their needs and the needs of their youth members.

## YOUTH LEADERS PROGRAM

As part of our Youth Program, and overarching our Youth Program Pathways, is the opt-in Youth Leaders Program (YLP). This Program, in which participants gain levels based on their involvement across a range of lifesaving, training and surf sports activities, is designed to reward youth members for their commitment.

Key statistics for this season were:

- 150 registered for the YLP
- 34 obtained Gold level
- 45 obtained Silver level
- 75 obtained Bronze level

## YOUTH PROGRAM PATHWAYS

Supplementing the Youth Program is a range of courses designed to introduce youth members to some of the pathways available to them as they progress through our movement. We had great attendance at our courses over the season in both metropolitan and regional venues.

- Youth Official – 66 attendees
- Youth Coach – 64 attendees
- Youth Age Managers – 59 attendees
- Youth Trainers – 53 attendees

## YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CAMPS

Held in late December 2021, the Rise Up Camp was held at Point Peron, allowing us to increase the capacity of this popular camp to sixty-one U17 participants. The Rise Up Camp aims to develop leadership skills and increase participants' awareness of the importance of teamwork. Whilst on the camp, participants have the opportunity to gain their Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate.

In early January 2022, the T.O.A.D. Camp was held at Ern Halliday Recreation Camp, with seventy-two U14s & U15s attending the four-day camp, all gaining their Radio Operators Certificate in the process. We acknowledge the assistance and support of Sorrento Surf Life Saving Club in helping us with the program for this camp.

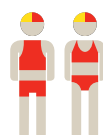

# TRAINING & EDUCATION

### MEMBER AWARDS

Training and Education activities in season 2021/22 were again delivered under the ongoing concerns and restrictions of COVID-19. Despite this, SLSWA Trainers, Assessors and Facilitators delivered 3,828 awards during the season, including 722 Bronze Medallions and 566 Surf Rescue Certificate qualifications.

In addition to the instructing of recognised certification awards, opportunities were also offered for members to participate in Advanced Lifesaving Training, with 274 members from 27 clubs attending across the season. This course is continually being developed, with content designed to improve members' lifesaving capabilities. This includes rock rescue training, deep water manikin retrieval and RWC rescue techniques to prepare them for higher-risk activities such as abalone patrols and emergency response.

Members were also provided with the opportunity to gain their HLTAID011 Provide First Aid qualification free of charge, with 464 members gaining this nationally accredited award.

### ROOKIE LIFEGUARD PROGRAM

The 2021/22 season saw the second instalment of our Lifeguard Academy's hugely popular Rookie Lifeguard Program. Developed by SLSWA to provide opportunities and a structured pathway for youth members, the week-long Program for members aged 16-17 delivers a range of fun, interactive and hands-on activities where Rookies have the opportunity to develop and learn skills across key operational areas.

The Program enhances participants' organisational awareness, skills, and fitness across the range of SLSWA programs/services and develops relationships and skills directly related to employment as a Lifeguard or other Support Operations functions within SLSWA.

On completion of the Program, ten Rookies were invited to go a step further and participate in the Lifeguard Immersion Program, through which candidates spend a week in on-the-job mentorship with professional SLSWA Lifeguards.

### FIRST AID TRAINING

In 2021 significant changes were made to the first aid units of competency delivered through the Vocational Education and Training (VET) system. As a Registered Training Organisation (RTO 51104), Surf Life Saving WA was required to undertake an application and audit process to deliver the new units of competency. This was completed for the essential First Aid courses in September 2021.

SLSWA delivers these first aid courses to volunteer members and the broader West Australian community, with the most popular courses being HLTAID009 Provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and HLTAID011 Provide First Aid.

Along with these upgraded units, SLSWA continues to offer a range of other VET accredited and non-accredited courses. This includes the Community Surf Rescue Certificate, the most common non-VET accredited community award required by teachers, surf coaches and outdoor recreation instructors.

### LIFE SKILLS FOR LIFE

The Life Skills for Life (LSFL) program continues to provide essential basic first aid training for school students across Western Australia. This interactive program for primary school-aged participants instils the knowledge, skills, and confidence for students to offer assistance in an emergency.

While school activities have been affected by COVID-19 restrictions in the past year, nearly 1,000 students attended LSFL sessions during the 2021/22 season.

### SURF SURVIVAL & BEACH ACTIVITIES

Delivered by SLSWA Surf Lifesavers, the Surf Survival and Beach Activities programs offer 'on the beach' training for school students to learn vital skills, including, board paddling and swimming in the surf, as well as teaching surf awareness such as recognising rips and other beach hazards.

The sessions are fun and active for students, with some schools including a final surf carnival-style event where students utilise their new skills in friendly competition. Over the 2021/22 season, more than 1,700 students from 23 schools attended these programs.

### SURFBABIES, SURFKIDS & HOLIDAY NIPPERS

The popular SurfBabies, SurfKids, and Holiday Nippers programs run by SLSWA at several beach locations around WA offer a fun and active introduction to beach safety and surf awareness for children and their parents. Last season 1,196 children aged 2-7 participated in the program across eight beach locations.

# COASTAL DROWNING RESEARCH

## DROWNING OVERVIEW



### OVERALL

- 17 coastal and ocean drownings deaths
- 19% decrease on the previous year



### DEMOGRAPHICS

- 100% were male
- Predominantly in the 50–59-year-old age group (average 1.45 per 100,000 population)



### TIME

- 73% occurred on weekdays
- 53% occurred between 12pm and 6pm
- 36% occurred in January and October
- 35% occurred in the summer



### ACTIVITY

- 35% related to swimming/wading
- 29% related to snorkelling
- 24% related to boating



### LOCATION (REGIONS)

- 12% occurred in the Perth Metropolitan area
- 53% occurred in regional areas
- 29% occurred in remote areas

The table below summarises the past three seasons of coastal and ocean drowning deaths in WA.

*These deaths are classified as either coastal or ocean, based on the distance from the shoreline, and figures are correct as of 1 July 2022. However, pending ongoing coronial investigations, this data may be amended. Figures may also differ from previous annual reports due to pending coronial investigations and differing reporting periods.*

*Coastal drowning death: Where the location of the drowning is on the coast, in the ocean up to 3NM offshore or inland up to five times the width of the inlet/river*

*Ocean drowning death: where the location of the drowning is in the ocean between 3NM and 12NM (the Australian territorial water limit).*

SLSWA collects and analyses coastal drowning data to identify trends and support evidence-based decision-making for drowning prevention efforts. Data is collected through media monitors and confirmed through the National Coronial Information System (NCIS).

While the figure of 17 is less than the previous two years, it remains far too many, and we will continue to work towards a goal of zero preventable drowning deaths off our coast.

We also recognise that this figure would be significantly higher were it not for the rescues performed by our lifesaving services in 2021/22.

According to the 2018 Cost Benefit Analysis of Surf Life Saving in WA, 5% of Total Rescues\* would have resulted in a fatality. This means that, without the 1,134 Total Rescues performed in WA across the 2021/22 season, the number of coastal and ocean drowning deaths would have potentially risen by a further 57 fatalities.

## MARKETING CAMPAIGNS

Our mission of saving lives and building great communities underpins the key messaging in all of our marketing activities, as we seek to promote beach-safe behaviours to the beach-going public and the sense of community and volunteerism that comes from being a member at one of our 31 WA clubs.

In 2021/22, we delivered the second year of our summer safety campaign featuring our Westpac Life Saver Rescue Helicopter Service. Raising awareness of its vital role in protecting WA beachgoers, we utilised traditional and digital mediums with a range of below-the-line resources to help educate the public and drive visitation to our website. Also key in our summer campaign is the ongoing messaging reminding beachgoers to visit a patrolled beach and to swim between the red & yellow flags.

Our Woodside Nippers membership campaign continues to help drive growth at our clubs as we again experienced an increase in Nipper numbers for the 2021/22 season. All campaign materials are provided to clubs to utilise across their channels, leveraging our campaign activity and helping build brand recognition.

## SOCIAL MEDIA & DIGITAL COMMUNICATIONS

We continue to experience positive organic growth across our social media channels and in visitation to our websites, which play a central role in our communications with members, stakeholders and the WA community.

We communicate year-round with our clubs, members and stakeholders via a range of eNewsletters, including our weekly administrative Club News, our member and stakeholders' My Beach eNews, and our in-season Nipper News to all our Woodside Nipper families. We also distribute a range of tailored communications to our various member demographics to ensure they receive content and news of interest to them.

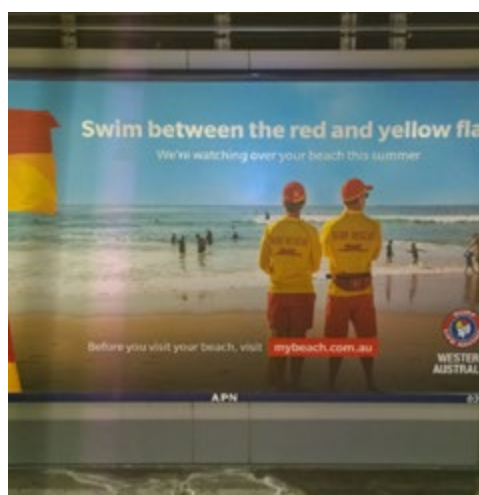

### WINTER APPEAL

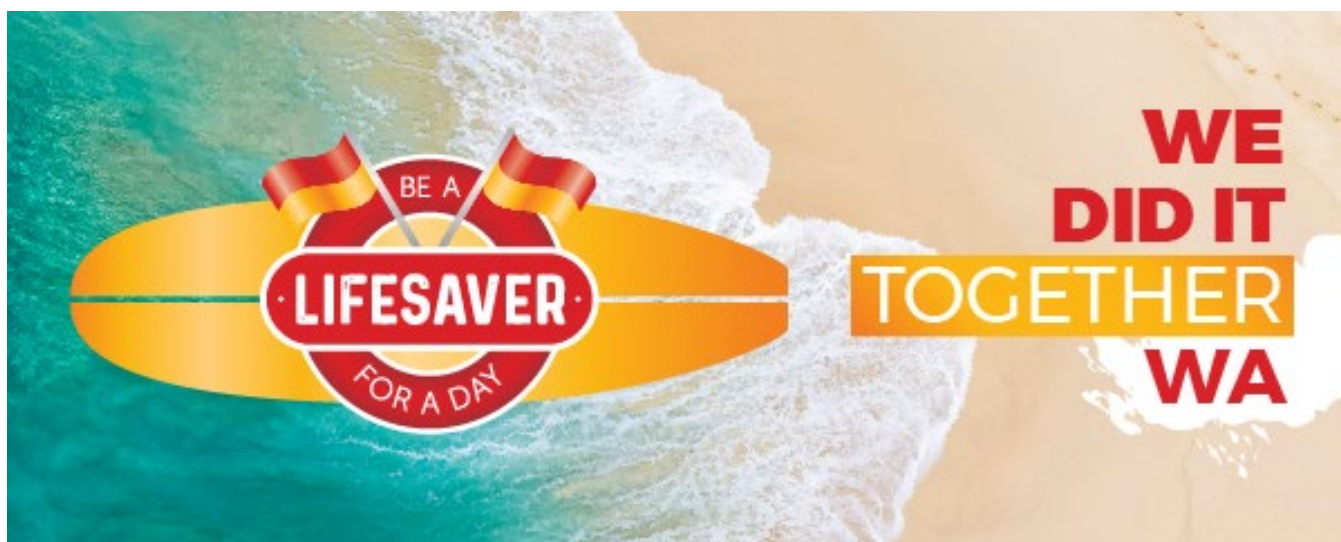

It’s a terrifying scenario – but unfortunately not a rare one. As every volunteer surf lifesaver knows, fun in the surf can turn into a fight for survival in a matter of seconds.

It’s awful to imagine what Danny felt as his nephew was swept out of his reach. Or how devastating it must have been for CJ’s mum – watching in horror from the shore, convinced that her little boy was “gone”.

But thankfully, volunteer surf lifesavers Jim and Joe were on the beach that day. In such dangerous conditions, rescuing CJ could have been close to impossible. But thanks to the support of the WA community, Geraldton Surf Life Saving Club is equipped with a Jet Ski – and skilled surf lifesavers who are trained to use it in rescues.

The Winter 2021 Appeal called for supporters to help West Aussie’s volunteer surf lifesavers are trained, equipped, and ready to help people no matter what conditions they face. Because of the generous response to this appeal, more volunteer surf lifesavers can receive the training and equipment they need to save lives when there’s no time to waste.

# CORPORATE GOVERNANCE

Surf Life Saving Western Australia Inc. (SLSWA) is an incorporated body under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015 (WA) and is recognised as the official 'State Centre' and controlling authority for Surf Life Saving in Western Australia. SLSWA is subject to compliance with the Rules and Regulations of Surf Life Saving Australia Ltd (SLSA) and is recognised for administering and focusing on surf lifesaving in Western Australia (WA). This statement summarises SLSWA's governance practices that were in effect during the year, highlighting decisions and reporting in accordance within the Rules and Regulations of SLSWA.

## Communications with Members

The SLSWA Board aims to ensure that members are kept informed of all major developments affecting surf lifesaving. Information is communicated to members through this document (SLSWA's Annual Report), bulletins, circulars, minutes and memorandums with respect to changes in business, financial position, future development, results and activities, and quarterly State Council meetings and member advisory board meetings. ## General Meetings of Members (State Council)

The State Council is the legal owner of SLSWA. Its role is to amend the SLSWA Constitution, review and elect the Board, review SLSWA's financial position and approve the strategic outcomes presented by the Board.

The State Council comprises the Chairman (President of the Board), Mr Craig Smith-Gander AM and a Club Delegate from each of the affiliated clubs in WA each with the right to vote at general meetings. The Chairman may exercise a casting vote but no deliberative vote. SLSWA Life Members, Board Members, and the Chief Executive Officer have the right to be present and to debate at general meetings, but not to vote. SLSWA full-time and honorary officers and individual members were allowed to attend general meetings as visitors. In addition to the AGM on 11 September 2021, the Board under Part 21, Para 21.1 of the SLSWA Constitution, convened two State Council meetings held on 12 June 2021 and 11 September 2021.

The Board comprised the Chairman and seven Board Members who are individual members of SLSWA, each with the right to one vote on any question. The Chairman has a casting vote but no deliberative vote. These are honorary positions that attract no remuneration except for reimbursement of expenses such as telephone, travel and accommodation costs incurred whilst performing Board activities. Board Members are elected in accordance with Part 25, Para 25(a) of the SLSWA Constitution.

### Code of Conduct

The Board has in place a Code of Conduct contained in its Personnel Handbook which all full-time and honorary officers and committee members must adhere to. An induction program, including the provision of the handbook and member brochure was made available to all SLSWA personnel.

### Chief Executive Officer

SLSWA's most senior employee, the Chief Executive Officer is appointed by the Board and is subject to annual performance reviews by the Board. The role is responsible for the day-to-day operations of SLSWA. Mr. James O'Toole was appointed to this position, officially commencing on 18 February 2015.

### COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Committees and member advisory boards are constituted by Part 33 of the SLSWA Constitution to assist the Board in the discharge of its responsibilities. The committees and member advisory boards are for held for one-year term, this term being 2021/2022. The Australian Honours and Awards Committee is held for two-year term, this being 2020/2021 and 2021/2022.

#### Australian Honours and Awards Committee

The Life Members and Awards Committee recommends to the Board nominations of individual members for SLSWA Life Membership, SLSA Life Membership, appropriate levels of Australian Honours and Awards. #### Lifesaving Committee

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

## FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2022

### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a general purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards (including Australian Accounting Interpretations), other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board, the requirements of the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission Act 2012 and the Associations Incorporation Act 2015.

The financial report covers Surf Life Saving Western Australia Inc. as an individual entity. Surf Life Saving Western Australia Inc. is an Association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act 2015.

The financial report of Surf Life Saving Western Australia Inc. as an individual entity complies with all Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards (AIFRS) in their entirety. Compliance with AIFRS ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the Association in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

#### Basis of preparation

The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented.

##### *Reporting Basis and Conventions*

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied. The amounts presented in the financial report are present in Australian dollars and have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

#### New, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Association has adopted all of the new, revised or amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new, revised or amending Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the Association's annual financial statements for the previous reporting period.

#### Accounting Policies

##### (a) Income Tax

The Association has obtained tax-exempt status under current Australian Taxation legislation.

##### (b) Current and non-current classification

Assets and liabilities are presented in the statement of financial position based on current and non-current classification.

An asset is classified as current when: it is either expected to be realised or intended to be sold or consumed in the Association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is expected to be realised within 12 months after the reporting period; or the asset is cash and cash equivalent unless restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other assets are classified as non-current.

A liability is classified as current when: it is either expected to be settled in the Association's normal operating cycle; it is held primarily for the purpose of trading; it is due to be settled within 12 months after the reporting period; or there is no unconditional right to defer the settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. All other liabilities are classified as non-current.

##### (c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value as indicated less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

##### *Property*

Freehold land and buildings are recorded at their fair value (being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction), based on periodic, but at least triennial valuations by external independent valuers. During the intervening periods, the fair values are determined on the basis of a Directors' valuation.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation reserve in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are recognised against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are recognised in profit or loss.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Cont.)

#### **Plant and Equipment**

Plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis less depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by Directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the assets' employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### **Depreciation**

The depreciable amount of plant and equipment along with the motor vehicles and building fitouts are depreciated on a diminishing value basis or straight line basis over their useful life from the time the asset is held ready for use.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets (excluding land and buildings) are:

Assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each balance date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount. These gains and losses are included in the statement of comprehensive income.

#### (d) **Impairment of Assets**

At each reporting date, the Association reviews the carrying values of its tangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the assets fair value less costs to sell and value-in-use, is compared to the assets carrying value. Any excess of the assets carrying value over its recoverable amount is expensed to the statement of comprehensive income.

Where it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of an individual asset, the Association estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

#### (e) **Fair Value Measurement**

When an asset or liability, financial or non-financial, is measured at fair value for recognition or disclosure purposes, the fair value is based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date; and assumes that the transaction will take place either: in the principal market; or in the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market.

Fair value is measured using the assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, assuming they act in their economic best interest. For non-financial assets, the fair value measurement is based on its highest and best use. Valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, are used, maximising the use of relevant observable inputs and minimising the use of unobservable inputs.

#### (f) **Employee Benefits**

Provision is made in respect of the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to balance date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled, plus related on-costs. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits.

#### (g) **Cash and Cash Equivalents**

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

#### (h) Revenue recognition

The Association recognises revenue as follows:

##### **Revenue from contracts with customers**

Revenue is recognised at an amount that reflects the consideration to which the association is expected to be entitled in exchange for transferring goods or services to a customer. For each contract with a customer, the association: identifies the contract with a customer; identifies the performance obligations in the contract; determines the transaction price which takes into account estimates of variable consideration and the time value of money; allocates the transaction price to the separate performance obligations on the basis of the relative stand-alone selling price of each distinct good or service to be delivered; and recognises revenue when or as each performance obligation is satisfied in a manner that depicts the transfer to the customer of the goods or services promised.

##### **Grants/ Sponsorship**

Grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the Association satisfies the performance obligations stated within the funding agreements. If performance obligations are not sufficiently specific, the Association recognises this revenue, at a point in time, which is generally on receipt.

##### **Donations**

Revenue from donations is recognised upon receipt of the funds.

##### **Interest**

Interest revenue is recognised on a proportional basis taking into account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

##### **Volunteer Services**

The Association has elected not to recognise volunteer services as either revenue or other forms of contributions received. As such, any related consumption or capitalisation of such resources received is also not recognised.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

#### (j) Financial assets

##### **Initial recognition**

Financial assets are classified, at initial recognition, and subsequently measured at amortised cost, fair value through other comprehensive income (OCI), or fair value through profit or loss.

The classification of financial assets at initial recognition that are debt instruments depends on the financial asset's contractual cash flow characteristics and the Association's business model for managing them. Trade receivables that do not contain a significant financing component, are measured at their transaction price.

In order for a financial asset to be classified and measured at amortised cost, it needs to give rise to cash flows that are 'solely payments of principal and interest (SPPI)' on the principal amount outstanding. This assessment is referred to as the SPPI test and is performed at an instrument level. The Association's business model for managing financial assets refers to how it manages its financial assets in order to generate cash flows. The business model determines whether cash flows will result from collecting contractual cash flows, selling the financial assets, or both.

##### **Subsequent measurement**

For purposes of subsequent measurement, financial assets are classified in four categories:

- Financial assets at amortised cost (debt instruments);
- Financial assets at fair value through OCI with recycling of cumulative gains and losses (debt instruments);
- Financial assets designated at fair value through OCI with no recycling of cumulative gains and losses upon derecognition (equity instruments); or
- Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### **Financial assets at amortised cost**

Financial assets at amortised cost are subsequently measured using the effective interest rate ('EIR') method and are subject to impairment. Interest received is recognised as part of finance income in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised, modified or impaired.

The Association's financial assets at amortised cost include trade and other receivables.

#### **Other financial assets**

The Association does not have any financial assets that are measured and recognised at fair value through OCI or at fair value through profit or loss.

#### **Derecognition**

A financial asset (or, where applicable, a part of a financial asset or part of a group of similar financial assets) is primarily derecognised when the rights to receive cash flows from the asset have expired.

#### **Impairment of financial assets**

The Association recognises an allowance for ECLs for all debt instruments not held at fair value through profit or loss. ECLs are based on the difference between the contractual cash flows due in accordance with the contract and all the cash flows that the Association expects to receive, discounted at an approximation of the original EIR. ECLs are recognised in two stages. For credit exposures for which there has not been a significant increase in credit risk since initial recognition, ECLs are provided for credit losses that result from default events that are possible within the next 12-months (a 12-month ECL). For those credit exposures for which there has been a significant increase in credit risk since initial recognition, a loss allowance is required for credit losses expected over the remaining life of the exposure, irrespective of the timing of the default (a lifetime ECL).

For trade receivables and other receivables due in less than 12 months, the Association applies the simplified approach in calculating ECLs, as permitted by AASB 9. Therefore, the Association does not track changes in credit risk, but instead, recognises a loss allowance based on the financial asset's lifetime ECL at each reporting date. When determining whether the credit risk of a financial asset has increased significantly since initial recognition and when estimating ECLs, the Association considers reasonable and supportable information that is relevant and available without undue cost or effort. This includes both quantitative and qualitative information and analysis, based on the Association's historical experience and informed credit assessment including forward-looking information.

The Association considers a financial asset in default when internal or external information indicates that the Association is unlikely to receive the outstanding contractual amounts in full before taking into account any credit enhancements held by the Association. A financial asset is written off when there is no reasonable expectation of recovering the contractual cash flows and is not subject to enforcement activity.

At each reporting date, the Association assesses whether financial assets carried at amortised cost are credit-impaired. A financial asset is credit-impaired when one or more events that have a detrimental impact on the estimated future cash flows of the financial asset have occurred.

### (k) **Financial Liabilities**

#### **Initial recognition**

Financial liabilities are classified, at initial recognition, as financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss, loans and borrowings or payables, as appropriate.

All financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value and, in the case of loans and borrowings and payables, net of directly attributable transaction costs. The Association's financial liabilities include trade and other payables and accruals.

#### **Subsequent measurement**

##### *Trade and Other payables, Accruals*

After initial recognition, trade and other payables and accruals are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Gains and losses are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the liabilities are derecognised.

#### **Derecognition**

A financial liability is derecognised when the associated obligation is discharged, cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### (l) Right of Use Assets

A right-of-use asset is recognised at the commencement date of a lease. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost, which comprises the initial amount of the lease liability, adjusted for, as applicable, any lease payments made at or before the commencement date net of any lease incentives received, any initial direct costs incurred, and, except where included in the cost of inventories, an estimate of costs expected to be incurred for dismantling and removing the underlying asset, and restoring the site or asset.

Right-of-use assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful life of the asset, whichever is the shorter. Where the Association expects to obtain ownership of the leased asset at the end of the lease term, the depreciation is over its estimated useful life. Right-of-use assets are subject to impairment or adjusted for any remeasurement of lease liabilities.

The Association has elected not to recognise a right-of-use asset and corresponding lease liability for short-term leases with terms of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. Lease payments on these assets are expensed to profit or loss as incurred.

#### (m) Lease Liabilities

A lease liability is recognised at the commencement date of a lease. The lease liability is initially recognised at the present value of the lease payments to be made over the term of the lease, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the Association's incremental borrowing rate. Lease payments comprise of fixed payments less any lease incentives receivable, variable lease payments that depend on an index or a rate, amounts expected to be paid under residual value guarantees, exercise price of a purchase option when the exercise of the option is reasonably certain to occur, and any anticipated termination penalties. The variable lease payments that do not depend on an index or a rate are expensed in the period in which they are incurred.

Lease liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. The carrying amounts are remeasured if there is a change in the following: future lease payments arising from a change in an index or a rate used; residual guarantee; lease term; certainty of a purchase option and termination penalties. When a lease liability is remeasured, an adjustment is made to the corresponding right-of-use asset, or to profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset is fully written down.

#### (n) Critical accounting judgements, estimates and assumption

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results. The judgements, estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

##### **Grant income**

For grant funding received, the determination of whether the grant agreement includes sufficiently specific performance obligations was a significant judgement involving discussions with a number of parties at the Association and consideration of the terms and conditions within the agreement.

Grants received by the Association have been accounted for under both AASB 15 and AASB 1058 depending on the terms and conditions and decisions made. If this determination was changed then the revenue recognition pattern would be different from that recognised in these financial statements.

##### **Impairment of non-financial assets other than goodwill and other indefinite life intangible assets**

The Association assesses impairment of non-financial assets other than goodwill and other indefinite life intangible assets at each reporting date by evaluating conditions specific to the Association and to the particular asset that may lead to impairment. If an impairment trigger exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is determined. This involves fair value less costs of disposal or value-in-use calculations, which incorporate a number of key estimates and assumptions.

##### **Employee benefits provision**

The liability for employee benefits expected to be settled more than 12 months from the reporting date are recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.
