Audience:	Club Administrators, Club Director of Lifesaving and Equipment Officers	
Summary:	Clubs are reminded to update SurfGuard with details and current condition of key lifesaving gear and equipment before the first patrol of the new season. This activity is to ensure key lifesaving gear and equipment are fit for purpose and rescue ready, safe for use and readily available and accessible.	
Action:	1. Refer table below.	

Management and oversight of key lifesaving gear and equipment is critical to ensure items are:

- a) fit for purpose and rescue ready.
- b) safe for use.
- c) readily available and accessible.

In turn, this will ensure:

- a) expectations related to lifesaving services can be fulfilled.
- b) members are not exposed to avoidable dangers or hazards.
- c) any gaps in items (quantities, type, etc.) can be addressed through renewal and replacement programs or initiatives.

SurfGuard is the platform to be used by clubs to manage key lifesaving gear and equipment. It is considered necessary that key information associated with these items is captured for record keeping and reporting in line with standardised inspection checklists.

In preparation for the upcoming season, it is recommended clubs inspect all key lifesaving gear and equipment, as shown in Attachment 1, prior to the first patrol. Only inspected and equipment assessed as fit for purpose should be used on patrol. Inspections can be completed using paper-based checklist that can be downloaded from SurfGuard or paperless checklists via the Operations App.

Four process steps are required to achieve this:

STEP	ACTION		
1	Ensure all key lifesaving gear and equipment is captured within SurfGuard equipment management module.		
2	Download and complete paper-based inspection checklists for key lifesaving gear and equipment.	Gain access to complete inspections via the Operations App and complete paperless checklist for key lifesaving gear and equipment.	
3	Update all key lifesaving gear and equipment information from the inspection into SurfGuard. Retain copies of inspection checklists.	No action required as information is sent from the Operations App to SurfGuard.	
4	Address any gaps, issues or deficiencies with gear and equipment.

Completion of inspections and the update of the information into SurfGuard will ensure your club is ready to conduct patrols this upcoming season. The information obtained from SurfGuard will also assist SLSWA in completing state and national reporting to external bodies.

Step 1 - Review and confirm all key gear and equipment is captured within SurfGuard

Clubs can access the relevant areas within SurfGuard by using the following pathway:

Menu > Organisational Management > Manage Gear & Equipment



Details of key lifesaving gear and equipment can be captured in this area using the "Manage" button against each type. At a minimum, please complete the compulsory information required, as denoted by *.

New equipment can only be entered by using Surfguard.

Existing equipment can be audited by using the Operations App. For a member to gain access to this feature they need the 'Gear and Equipment Auditor (Club Endorsed)' award. Contact SLSWA to obtain it.

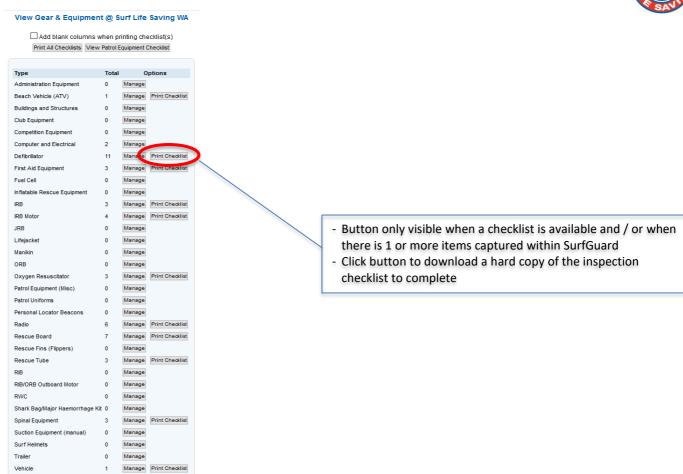

Step 2 - Download and complete inspection checklists for key lifesaving gear and equipment.

Inspection checklists for key lifesaving gear and equipment can be obtained by using the "Print Checklist" button against each type. Checklists are not available for all types of gear and equipment but when available is only visible when 1 or more items have been captured within SurfGuard. At a minimum, please complete the compulsory information within each checklist highlighted in grey.





Each inspection checklist is different, however each checklist does use the same equipment condition rating system with the following descriptions provided to assist in determining the state of gear & equipment:

Rating	Description	Condition / Usability	Action
P = Pass	New or near new condition	Excellent /	No further action required
	Fully operationalNo safety issues or damage	Suitable for use	
F = Fair	 Fully operational Item may have age or damage that does not hinder operation or safety (e.g. scratches) 	Good / Use with care	Continue use with regular monitoring and action when / as required
R = Re-inspect	 Out of service items requiring repair Items that need external / professional verification 	Not suitable for use	DO NOT USE until repaired to safe standard suitable for use or re-inspected by an external body
D = Discard	 Beyond economical repair Irreparable damage negatively affecting safety or function Legacy item no longer required 	Replacement Required / Not suitable for use	Discard (e.g. sell, recycle) and inform SLSWA prior to removing this item from SurfGuard


Step 3 - Update all key lifesaving gear and equipment information within SurfGuard with details from inspections.

Once each inspection is completed, update details of key lifesaving gear and equipment by again using the "Manage" button against each type. At a minimum, please complete the compulsory information required, as denoted by *, but also any other key information that describes the current condition or future life expectancy of the item.

Step 4 - Address any gaps, issues or deficiencies with gear and equipment. Discuss with the SLSWA Lifesaving team as required.

Identify strategies to close any gaps, resolve issues or rectify deficiencies with gear and equipment through repair, renewal or replacement strategies. Clubs are encouraged to discuss any issues that cannot be resolved within the club or will negatively impact capability to deliver lifesaving services with the SLSWA Lifesaving team as soon as possible.
