A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR RICHARD CARROLL

THE OKLAHOMA TERRITORY IN 1906 LAY BEYOND THE WESTERN REACHES OF THE FEDERATED UNITED STATES.

A land of shotgun rides, shotgun weddings, and shotgun justice. No local government, no electricity, no motor cars. In popular culture we're used to seeing this place and time portrayed as a hard, gritty world where men are men, women are women, and individualism



is King. Well, you won't see that world here. The kernel of the idea for this production came from a conversation I had back in 2018 with Black Swan's incredible artistic director Clare Watson – wouldn't the characters in *Oklahoma!* actually be a curious bunch of misfits and outsiders, who had each left their own communities to come to this territory and form their own society? And doesn't Jud - the supposed 'outsider' of the community - actually represent conformity and repression, as his actions distinctly suggest?

And so we came to think a lot about identity and community while building this production - as the territory prepares to become an official state of the Union, the attractions and complications of shifting identity seem to seep out of the dirt and throw many of the characters off-balance. The power that comes with truly grasping and accepting our own identity - and the warmth that comes when that is accepted and celebrated by our community - are as potent today as they have ever been. The threat of male violence remains as devastatingly present as it ever has. And it remains as inspiring as ever to witness those who refuse to let the hurt and ugliness they suffer deprive them of experiencing the true joys of life. Love; self-determination; music; freedom from shame.

The spare yet surprisingly vivid book, and indestructible songs of Oklahoma! seem to have burned a hole in the psyche of anyone who calls themselves a fan of musical theatre (which I do, passionately and unabashedly). The score was written in the style of folk music, and many of the songs have become almost folk songs themselves. To have this rudely talented cast, band, creative and production team unleash their formidable minds and talents onto this classic at the wonderful Black Swan State Theatre Company has been a privilege and a joy. While this might not look or sound quite like a 'traditional' production of Oklahoma!, I hope you'll sense that all of our work has grown out of the fundamental joys and strengths of the immortal work of Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein II themselves perhaps the original iconoclasts and rule-breakers in the world of musical theatre.

This is my first time telling stories on Nyoongar Whadjuk Boodjar, and what a privilege that is too. I believe it's our greatest honour as Australians that we live and work on Aboriginal land, home to the oldest storytelling culture in the world. Always was, always will be.

RICHARD CARROLL - DIRECTOR

Richard Carroll is a director, writer and producer based in Sydney. He directed an acclaimed production of *Calamity Jane* at Hayes Theatre Co, starring Virginia Gay, which toured to five cities in 2018-19, including sold-out mainstage seasons at Arts Centre Melbourne (twice) and Belvoir, followed by a commercial season at Melbourne's Comedy Theatre. Richard's other directing work includes *Once* and *An Act Of God* (co-director) at Darlinghurst Theatre Co; *Spamalot*, *Gypsy* and *Side Show* at Hayes Theatre Co; *The Boy*, *George*, a one-man show starring comedian Joel Creasey; *The Show Goes On* starring Bernadette Robinson, at Sydney Opera House and Arts Centre Melbourne; *A Night At The Speakeasy* for Sydney Symphony Orchestra; and opening gala concerts for Adelaide Cabaret Festival and The Art House. He received a Sydney Theatre Award for *Calamity Jane*. He is also the producer and host of the popular podcast *Every Musical Ever*.



VICTORIA FALCONER - MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Victoria Falconer is an award-winning cabaret artist, multi-instrumentalist and musical director. Co-creator of acclaimed feminist firebrands Fringe Wives Club, their debut show *Glittery Clittery* has been presented at the Southbank Centre, Soho Theatre (London), Griffin Theatre (Sydney), Darwin Festival, Bats Theatre (Wellington) and at Edinburgh Fringe, where it received the Spirit of the Fringe Award in 2018. Two of Victoria's shows have won the Best Cabaret Award at Adelaide Fringe (2018/2011). In 2020 she was nominated for a Sydney Theatre Award (*Once*, Darlinghurst Theatre Company, dir. Richard Carroll) and a Green Room Award (*Glittergrass*, Malthouse Theatre) for musical direction. Other recent MD credits include *Bourgeois & Maurice's Insane Animals* (HOME Manchester), Courtney Act's *Under The Covers* (Underbelly London), *Unroyal Variety* (Hackney Empire) and *Sasquatch The Opera* (Summerhall, Edinburgh). Victoria is the Mentorship Director for The People of Cabaret, a collective dedicated to amplifying and advocating for BIPOC artists and performers.



JONATHON OXLADE - SET AND COSTUME DESIGNER

Jonathon is an award-winning designer. Jonathon is resident designer at Windmill Theatre Co and designs for companies including: Sydney Theatre Company, Melbourne Theatre Company, Queensland Theatre, State Theatre Company of South Australia, Belvoir Theatre, LaBoite, Bell Shakespeare, Is This Yours?, Aphids, Arena Theatre Company, Polyglot, The Real TV Project, Polytoxic, Men of Steel, Lemony S Puppet Theatre, Terrapin Puppet Theatre, Vitalstatistix, Barking Gecko, The Border Project, Dead Puppet Society, The Last Great Hunt, The Escapists and Sandpit. Jonathon designed the film *Girl Asleep* for which he won an ACCTA Award (Best Costume Design), received an ACCTA nomination (Best Production Design) and won two APDG Awards (Best Production Design and Best Costume Design). The same year, he won a Sydney Theatre Award for Best Costume Design for *Mr Burns* (Belvoir / State Theatre Company of South Australia); and a PAWA for *Mr Irresistible* for The Last Great Hunt. Jonathon is designing the stage adaptation of *Bluey* for BBC, Ludo Studio and AKA Productions.





TRENT SUIDGEEST - LIGHTING DESIGNER

Trent has designed 20+ productions for Black Swan, including co-productions with QT, MTC and Belvoir. Highlights include: *Next To Normal, Dinner, Other Desert Cities, Boy Get Girls, Managing Carmen, Gasp!, Shrine, Death Of A Salesman, The Sapphires* (touring Australia, London and South Korea).

Other highlights include Global Creatures/Sydney Theatre Company's Muriel's Wedding The Musical; Opera Australia's The Eighth Wonder and Carmen, which presented in both Sydney and Melbourne; Strictly Ballroom (WAAPA); Accidental Death Of An Anarchist, Hay Fever, Talk (Sydney Theatre Company), a national tour of Calamity Jane and Gypsy (both with director Richard Carroll), The View UpStairs, Only Heaven Knows (Hayes Theatre Co); First Love Is The Revolution, Prima Facie, The Homosexuals Or 'Faggots' (Griffin). Trent lit Jasper Jones and Duck, Death And The Tulip for Barking Gecko Theatre Company, as well as the multi-Helpmann Award-winning opera The Rabbits (with Opera Australia).



LUCY BIRKINSHAW - LIGHTING DESIGNER

Lucy Birkinshaw is an accomplished lighting designer and artist. Lucy's lighting practice encompasses theatre, opera, music theatre, concert lighting, dance, film and television. She trained formally in both fine arts and lighting for performance.

She enjoys collaborating with a diverse range of directors, choreographers and composers. Lucy's distinctive approach to depth, contrast and beauty within her designs make her an identifiable theatre artist.



TIM COLLINS - SOUND DESIGNER

Tim Collins is a sound designer, composer, musician, technician and tour manager. He has worked in the entertainment industry since 2001 involved in performance and logistics for theatre, festivals, concert and studio production, musical theatre and live broadcast. Tim has been a mentor at the West Australian Academy of Performing Arts since 2016. BERNADETTE LEWIS - CHOREOGRAPHER

Bernadette Lewis is a dance artist living on Whadjuk Noongar Boodjar (Borloo/Perth) working across performance, choreography, improvisation, teaching and community engagement. A WAAPA and LINK Dance graduate, she has performed in works by Tasdance, Anton, Frances Rings, Sue Peacock, Scott Elstermann, Jo Pollitt, Didier Théron, Natalie Allen, and in Maxine Doyle's Perth Festival commission *Sunset*. In 2014 she was nominated for most outstanding female performer at the WA Dance Awards. Her choreographic work includes new commissions by WAAPA, movement consultation for new theatre works by The Last Great Hunt and Riptide. Her first full length work, *The Honeymoon Suite*, was the recipient of the FRINGE WORLD Dance and Physical Theatre Award (2018). Since 2018 she has been producer and lead mentor of *Hidden Movements*, an experimental performance platform for young and emerging dancers based in the Borloo/Perth and Bindjareb/Peel regions.



LAURA BOYNES - MOVEMENT CONSULTANT

Laura is a graduate of WAAPA (BA Honours Dance). Her theatre credits include: Black Swan: You Know We Belong Together (Premiere and return seasons), Xenides and Medea Other Theatre: Actéon (Lost and Found Opera), Trigger Warning (Sally Richardson), Ice Land, (Yirra Yaakin Theatre Company) Selkie (Renegade Productions) and Ragnarokkr (Variegated Productions). As a dancer Laura has performed nationally and internationally in contemporary dance, theatre, experimental music, site-specific and opera works. In 2009-2013, she was a performer for Buzz Dance Theatre. As a choreographer, she has independently created multiple short and full-length works and co-directed large commissions for dance companies such as LINK Dance Company, Buzz Dance Theatre, CO:3 Youth Ensemble, and for WAAPA. She has been awarded 2014 Winner Australian Dance Award for Outstanding Achievement in Youth and Community Dance for Look the Other Way – Buzz Dance Theatre – in collaboration with Cadi McCarthy, 2016 - Most Outstanding Dancer (Dance Australia Critics Choice) for SousVide presented at the Adelaide Fringe Festival. Her solo work Wonder Woman was nominated for four PAWA Awards.
