Key facts

- Abuse affects both older men and women and can occur in home or care settings.
- Estimates suggest up to 39.2% of older people in residential aged care experience abuse in some form, including neglect, emotional, and/or physical abuse (Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety 2020).
- Abuse is often caused by someone trusted by the older person, such as a family member, friend or paid caregiver.
- In some cases, neither the person experiencing abuse nor the person causing harm recognises that abuse is occurring.

Health and aged care professionals **play a vital role** in identifying and addressing abuse of older people.
