Horizontal Geometries

Inspired by many elements of the Noongar people this mosaic sits at the base of the BHP Billiton Water Park. A collaboration between artists Sandra Hill and Jenny Dawson, the artwork represents the Dreaming story of the creation of the Milky Way.

This work atop the ferry terminal canopy examines ideas about air, sky and space through a myriad shapes that can be imagined to be puffs of smoke, or floating clouds.

This giant artwork runs the entire length of the inlet, illuminating the water.

EDGE can be programmed to reflect changing weather conditions, creating a spectacular night time light show.

First Contact is a stunning five metre tall, cast aluminium artwork by renowned indigenous artist, Laurel Nannup depicting the arrival of European settlers to Perth.

As the European boats arrived, the local Noongar people believed that these ships, were their past ancestors returning from the sea.

The Black Swan

This mural tells the story of how Western Australia's native Black Swans came to be. The swans, originally white, were attacked by eagles tearing out all their feathers after the swans visited the eagles lagoon. Crows flew to the rescue covering the swans with their own black feathers, transforming the swans coat to black and their bloodstained bills red forever.

Spanda links the river, the land and the sky to welcome visitors to the quay. Suitably, its form creates a feeling of openness and inclusion. Spanda has been designed to be appreciated from all angles, interpreted in many different ways and to interact with the art piece by walking through it.

The MRA is working with 12 talented Whadjuk emerging artists to develop their skills and confidence in delivering public art projects for Western Australia. These ephemeral artworks will be updated every 18 months, providing new opportunities for artists to display their work.

Signature Ring

This public art piece has hundreds of thousands of past school students signatures etched in copper plates that were collected in 1999 as part of the millennium celebrations. Signature Ring features fibre optics that illuminate the passage of time.
