### **REPOSTING - AN UPDATE**

Instagram has been making changes over the past few months to more than ever before reward original content. This means a fancy new Repost feature on the app, but also potential penalties for people reposting via other methods.




This new feature allows you to reshare public content within the app, allowing it to be posted to the newly instated Repost section of your profile, and also in your followers' feeds.

It's a great way to share content you love, while also boosting that post and giving credit to the original creator.

When reposting, you can also add a short comment, which gives context to your followers as to why you are reposting this particular post.

We recommend resposting via this method only, as any content found by Instagram to have been reposted via a 3rd party app, could lead to penalties - Instagram will replace that content with the original, meaning the post on your page will stop receiving engagement. If you do this on your account, please note you may be shadowbanned by the app.




### AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

## 2026 SYDNEY ROAD STREET PARTY - 01/03/26


