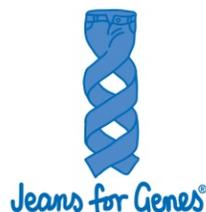

About the Role

A Windows Systems Administrator is sought to join a growing IT team that currently supports around 200 staff. The core objective of the role is to maintain, improve and support the critical IT infrastructure of CMRI, including core networks, firewalls, security, servers, storage, cloud, email and collaboration systems, while delivering great customer service directly to our staff. Main duties will comprise:-

- Providing support as part of the service desk, and triaging more complex requests to ensure they are routed to the appropriate specialist team member or vendor
- Development of a technical knowledgebase for IT staff and an end-user knowledgebase to cover common help topics
- Deploying specialist software
- Identifying and mitigating security risks to ensure safe operation of IT systems
- Administer Office 365 Exchange email and other Office 365 products
- Creation of user and email accounts within an Active Directory environment
- Identifying and evaluating new technologies to improve IT services
- Liaise with vendors for desktop, server and infrastructure products, ordering new equipment and managing any associated maintenance
- Performance monitoring of networks and systems
- Continued virtualization of systems, either into a Hyper-V, on-premise cluster or Microsoft Azure
- Assisting in researching, specifying, testing and recommending new technologies to deliver against the IT roadmap



- Work with research staff to evaluate and recommend technologies to assist in their projects
- Participate in an on-call roster for critical infrastructure

About You
