Locals and visitors who shop, dine and play along the Parramatta Light Rail route will enjoy great offers and giveaways as part of Transport for NSW's latest campaign to support local businesses.

Parramatta Light Rail A/Project Director Gabriel Gonzalez said the eight-week Facebook campaign will coincide with the school holidays, providing a fantastic incentive for families to discover Parramatta's diverse attractions, restaurants, and retail outlets on offer.

"It's exciting to see light rail track installation complete and major infrastructure work wrapping up, and there is no better time to grab the kids and enjoy meals, shopping and fun activities in the heart of Western Sydney, while supporting local businesses," Mr Gonzalez said.
