During discussion of the petition requesting Council install a protected bi-directional bikeway on Herschel Street, Brisbane City, Councillor Nicole Johnston moved the following motion:

"That words in paragraph 4 of Attachment A of the submission 'George Street' be deleted, and replaced with 'consideration of a bi-directional bikeway on Herschel Street between North Quay and George Street'".

Following debate, the A/Civic Cabinet Chair put the vote to the Committee and was declared lost, with Councillors Nicole Johnston and Charles Strunk voting in favour.

984 EXPENDITURE FROM SUBURBAN ENHANCEMENT FUND – APPROVAL FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNAL ARROWS AND LINE-MARKING AT ALL APPROACHES TO THE INTERSECTION OF WEBSTER ROAD, BILLABONG AND WOLVERHAMPTON STREETS, STAFFORD 182/255/344/3125

The General Manager, Commercial Services and Business Improvement, City Standards, Infrastructure Services, provided the following information.

Webster Road, Wolverhampton and Billabong Streets, Stafford, are classified as industrial streets in Council's *Brisbane City Plan 2014*.

Councillor Danita Parry, Councillor for Marchant Ward, has requested the installation of new red, amber and green traffic signal arrows and associated line-marking at all approaches to the intersection of Webster Road, Billabong and Wolverhampton Streets (the intersection), as indicated in Attachment A (submitted on file).

Effective delivery of this project will require:

- provision and installation of new red, amber and green traffic signal arrows and line-marking designs of all approaches to the intersection
- road closure permits
- traffic control.

Councillor Parry has requested that the proposed works be undertaken and funded from the Marchant Ward Suburban Enhancement Fund.

Infrastructure Committee approval is sought in line with the approved delegations for the Suburban Enhancement Fund.

Funding

Funds are currently available in Program 2 – Infrastructure for Brisbane.

Consultation

Councillor Danita Parry, Councillor for Marchant Ward, has been consulted and supports the recommendation.

Customer Impact

The installation of new traffic signal arrows and line-marking at all approaches to the intersection will greatly improve the safety for vehicles and pedestrians at this intersection.

The General Manager recommended as follows and the Committee unanimously agreed.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT APPROVAL BE GRANTED TO EXPEND \$150,000 FROM THE MARCHANT WARD SUBURBAN ENHANCEMENT FUND FOR THE INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNAL ARROWS AND LINE-MARKING AT ALL APPROACHES TO THE INTERSECTION OF WEBSTER ROAD, BILLABONG AND WOLVERHAMPTON STREETS, STAFFORD.
