The train or tramline is simple, people take notice and responsibility of respecting a train line been in the middle of their lives. People move around them and they have minimal WHS protection and are usually attractive with works of art and greenery (please see swiss trains).

The rail isnt going to prevent newcastle renewal... But small minded people will. The days of big shopping malls and multinational businesses are numbered. People are sick of them.
