Removal of the rail line from the Newcastle CBD will be a back wood step for the future development of the Hunter region & the infrastucture of NSW.

Rail lines in Europe and the US are being upgraded and very fast Train lines are being added between European capital cities. Fast Rail travel in Europe is now the preferred option over flight.

Maintaining & extending the rail network is vital to meeting the challenges of increased population and population densities. Rail provides far greater benefits over road transport.
