The attached text document includes a poem which should speak for itself, and relates to the non-option of the government's proposed demolition of the last 2 km of the existing railway [between Wickham and Newcastle stations] which would deprive locals and visitors of valuable journeys which they currently enjoy. Any option that reduces the standard and utility of the current services [to a level below that existing] must be a "total knock-out in the first round". That is to say such options are totally rejected, by "we, the people". Thinking laterally, if the rail alignment is moved sideways to be under King Street, new stations could be built at and under Birdwood Park and Civic Park, leading to all sorts of opportunities and benefits.
