

I am concerned that a DA. For a transport depot in the Myocum area has been approved by council, which is in a RU2 Rural Landscape zone, which is in amongst areas of E2 and E3 zones, and is within the precinct of a Koala corridor as determined by a Draft Koala Conservation plan which Byron Shire Council has submitted to the State Govt. of NSW. My own property which is partly large lot residential, but most of it is in the environmental living zone. I have planted hundreds of Wetland and Coastal rainforest trees, with the help of Govt. funding, to contribute to linking up the E2 and E3 zone areas in the Myocum/Tyagarah areas.

I do feel that this kind of landscape warrants environmental overlays in such a sensitive area if we are to be serious about conservation of what is left of the coastal wild life corridor. I do believe that farming practices and the environment can work along side one another to a mutual benefit. Farmland and its use as I understand it needs to be directly related to soil, and not used for a warehouse and distribution centre, especially in such an environmentally sensitive area.
