SSHEG considers that current 2015 State Environmental Planning Policy almost exclusively fails to incorporate SEPPs that mandate or consider Human Disease Risks and Hazards posed by developments such as "Cumulative Health Impact Studies and Health Risk Assessments"; such as posed by Open Cut Mining and Coal Fired Power Stations in the Hunter Valley.

If State Environmental Planning Policy established Human Disease Impacts especially of "*Rural Residents as Near Neighbours*" at the Project Initiation Stage, then a controlled development is more likely to gain a "Social Licence" and Community acceptance.

The Human Diseases reported by Singleton Shire Residents prompted the establishment of SSHEG in 2008.

Special Reference should be made to *Attachment 1* which details and summarises SSHEG documents and collaboration with Authorities and Stakeholders since 2009 to resolve these Community Health Issues.
