Re Draft CCC Guidelines and your request for committee members to comment for you to include in your direct response as Chair of a CCC.

CVA discussed the following at the CCC meeting dated 15 March 2016 for you to include in your submission as Chair.

You confirmed at the meeting you would include all committee comments in your submission but not Dr Haydn's response to you in another email.

CVA's points for you to include in the Community consultative committee guidelines draft to be submitted to Dept. of Planning are;

1.

Clause 6. Work together towards social, environmental and economic outcomes that benefit immediate neighbours, the local and regional community, and the development

CVA submits Dr Haydn Washington's views – " an environmental scientist and someone who has written extensively about environmental ethics, I find it very odd that the it suggests we only work on environmental outcomes that benefit only immediate neighbours, local community and the development itself! This area is a State Conservation Area of significance to the whole of NSW and its national significance has been accepted by the World Heritage Advisory Committee that would like to add Mugii Murum-ban SCA to the Greater blue mountains world heritage area. Hence we should all be interested in environmental outcomes that benefit both the environment itself as well as NSW and Australia as a whole (not just local neighbours). **Point 6 is thus far too narrow and fails to recognize the significance of the site to NSW, Australia and indeed the world.**

2. clause 1. says:

Establish good working relationships between the Company, the community and other key stakeholders on individual projects

CVA submits this is too narrow as there should be good working relations with environmental non-government organisations (NGOS) also, and this should be spelled out.

3. clause 2. Says

Allow ongoing communication of information on the project and environmental performance, including about : Including 6 dot points

CVA submits that Centennial on the day of the CCC meeting's usually have a PowerPoint presentation and then send out the hard copy with the minutes some time later. (November's received with Minutes via email on 30 November.

CVA believes the hard copy should be sent with the agenda prior to the meeting so members of the CCC and in particular the community representatives have time to absorb the content and then able to ask questions at the

CCC on the day its presented, requests for further information can be recorded in the Minutes if follow up is required. This should be amended to include items/reports to be attached to the agenda and received prior the day of the meeting.

Could you please confirm your inclusion of the above in your submission.
