DRAFT AMENDMENMT TO SYDNEY REGIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL PLAN 26 - CITY WEST - TEMPORARY SCHOOL IN WENTWORTH PARK

I refer to the Department of Planning and Environment's (DP&E) correspondence dated 20 September 2016 and 5 October 2016 regarding the subject amendment to Sydney Regional Environmental Plan (SREP) No 26 - City West which was forwarded to Roads and Maritime Services for comment.

The proposal seeks the amendment to Sydney Regional Environmental Plan (SREP) No 26 – City West to introduce the following clauses:

- Permit a temporary school without consent by or on behalf of a public authority on part of Wentworth Park,
- The school will cease operation by 31 December 2019, and
- Requirements to consult with Council and other public authorities as provided for under Part 2 of Division 1 under State Environmental Planning Policy (Infrastructure) 2007 Infrastructure SEPP) will apply.

It is understood that the proposed changes to SREP 26 would allow a temporary school to be considered under Part 5 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

Roads and Maritime have reviewed the submitted material and raise no objection to the abovementioned amendments to Sydney Regional Environmental Plan (SREP) No 26 – City West subject to the following issues listed below being satisfactorily addressed:

1. DP&E ensuring that the Roads and Maritime Services would be formally consulted for feedback / comment about this proposal (by the Department of Education) as part of the Part 5 Assessment process due to the following concerns:

- The drop off and collection of school children. The western kerbside of Wattle Street is restricted in the morning peak and we have concerns that parents would ignore the clearway restrictions on this important "state road" corridor to drop off students at the temporary accommodation.
- Construction and demolition activities will need to be co-ordinated with other major developments in the CBD, particularly the Bays Precinct and most likely require a Construction Traffic Management Plan to be developed.
