What is being consulted on?

- The NSW Government has released the *Draft Far West Regional Plan* (the Plan) for the community and stakeholders to have a say about the future of this important region over the next 20 years.
- The draft Plan outlines a 20-year vision to diversify the economy by supporting job growth, and strengthening Broken Hill the region's strategic centre, and other local centres throughout the region.
- The draft Plan applies to Broken Hill, Wentworth, Balranald, Central Darling, Cobar, Walgett, Brewarrina, Bourke and the Unincorporated Area.
- The Draft Far West Regional Plan is the first time a land use plan has been prepared for the Far West region.

Why do we need a regional plan?

- The draft Plan provides the strategic framework to manage change across the region over the next 20 years.
- It integrates economic, environmental and social considerations to achieve ecologically sustainable development—a priority for the region.
- By 2036 the number of residents aged 65 years and over will rise to 28 per cent in the region. This increase will create a demand for age related services and have an impact on housing, jobs and services.

What goals have been set to achieve this vision?

- Goal 1 A diverse economy with efficient transport and infrastructure networks
- Goal 2 An exceptional and distinctive natural environment
- Goal 3 Strong and connected communities

What does the Plan say about the economy and infrastructure (Goal 1)?

- The draft Plan aims to:
 - o Grow the economic potential of the agribusiness and manufacturing sectors by protecting agricultural land and maximising value add opportunities
 - o Promote tourism opportunities, including eco-tourism, agri-tourism and cultural heritage
 - o Support the sustainable use and conservation of natural resources, including water, minerals and energy resources (including renewable energy)
 - o Enhance the economic self-determination of Aboriginal communities
 - o Improve the freight network by identifying and prioritising improvements on regionally significant roads
 - o Improve regional airport connections and protect airports from development pressure
 - o Enhance access to telecommunications, such as high speed internet.

What does the plan say about the environment (Goal 2)?

- The draft Plan aims to:
 - o Protect the environments
 - o Manage and conserve water
 - o Increase resilience to natural hazards including drought, bushfire, flood, and other impacts of climate change.

What does the plan say about communities (Goal 3)?

- The draft Plan aims to:
 - o Manage changing demographics and improve access to local health, transport and aged care
 - o Increase housing choice and improve the availability of affordable housing
 - o Protect cultural heritage sites and create healthy built environments

What happens next?

- The feedback received throughout the consultation period will inform the finalisation of the plans.
- The final Plan can be then delivered in one of two ways:
 - o alongside the Far West Initiative
 - o by establishing a coordination and monitoring committee that would deliver, coordinate and be accountable for achieving the vision and goals of the Plan.
- The NSW Government's preference is delivery alongside the Far West Initiative.
