RE: INGLESIDE HOUSING PROJECT

I have lived on the northern beaches for over a decade and it upsets me greatly that yet another huge housing project is planned for our area.

The housing project at Warriewood caused a large influx of extra cars on the local roads and there is congestion on the roads almost all day along the major roads of Pittwater Road, Wakehurst Parkway, Forest Way and Powderworks Road.

There is inadequate public transport for the whole area. The introduction of a B Line from Mona Vale to the City is not a solution especially as the L90 is already so frequent - about every 10-15 minutes.

The impact of all the extra traffic is in my opinion causing stress to people, especially as they make their way to and from work as well as taking kids to and from school.

The big losers in the planned housing project is NATURE.

Cutting trees, removing bushland and covering the soil with slabs of concrete - over 3,000 new houses!

What will happen to the water quality and flow of the streams as they empty into Narrabeen Lagoon ?

What will happen to the fauna, flora and vegetation communities that are presently living there?

What will happen to the wildlife and birds currently living there?

IT IS TERRIBLY SAD THAT WE ARE REMOVING OUR BUSHLAND TO BUILD THOUSANDS OF HOUSES.
