The Campbelltown area needs to change its status of a lower socio economic area & an area of underprivilege.

Priority needs to be given to:-

→ The demolition of the Macquarie Fields public housing - by this I mean urban-renewal - public/private housing mix (Minto was changed for the better).

It (the current consequences) of housing trends

• unemployment

• drug use

• crime

• assault

• mental health issues

⇒ ditto for the Ingleburn public housing area.

In addition local centres need to become more interesting - of note

→ The Glenfield shops. (opp station) whatever needs to be done to allow a mixed commercial/residential



Stonery Needs immediate action.

⇒ Ingleburn Village. The red tape mess has come to a halt. What ever the owner needs I suggest you cut the red tape to allow its completion.

⇒ Walkways. The current lack of water/cycleways is a major concern.

We have an asset in the upper Georges River and it MUST be utilised as a major walking/fitness destination.

\* I suggest a suspended eco-walkway from Glentfield to Campbelltown with exits points at each suburb.

It should be suspended above the river so it takes in the natural bush.



overtime this can be extended to Liverpool - so potentially you could walk from Westfield Liverpool to Campbelltown without seeing any traffic!

It could become a major tourist point!

The areas pools are deficient.

In both the TCT & Newcastle there are facilities for spas/sauna/ice baths & recovery. These are the facilities that draw people to live & stay in areas.

\* The litter around the Mylcham Coles facility is disgraceful & when I walk from Blagden Ave to Coles I find myself thinking I would never invite my city friends here I am embarrassed & ashamed that it is left like that. !!

\* Can we have cameras inserted at the edge of the carpark & down Cambridge St & signs stating that Council will monitor litter & impose fines.

Alternatively mandate that the Village employ someone on \$40k a year to keep these streets clean of litter.
