All are welcome to provide feedback on the draft Old East Village Dundas Street Corridor Secondary Plan and the results of the East-West Bikeway Evaluation.

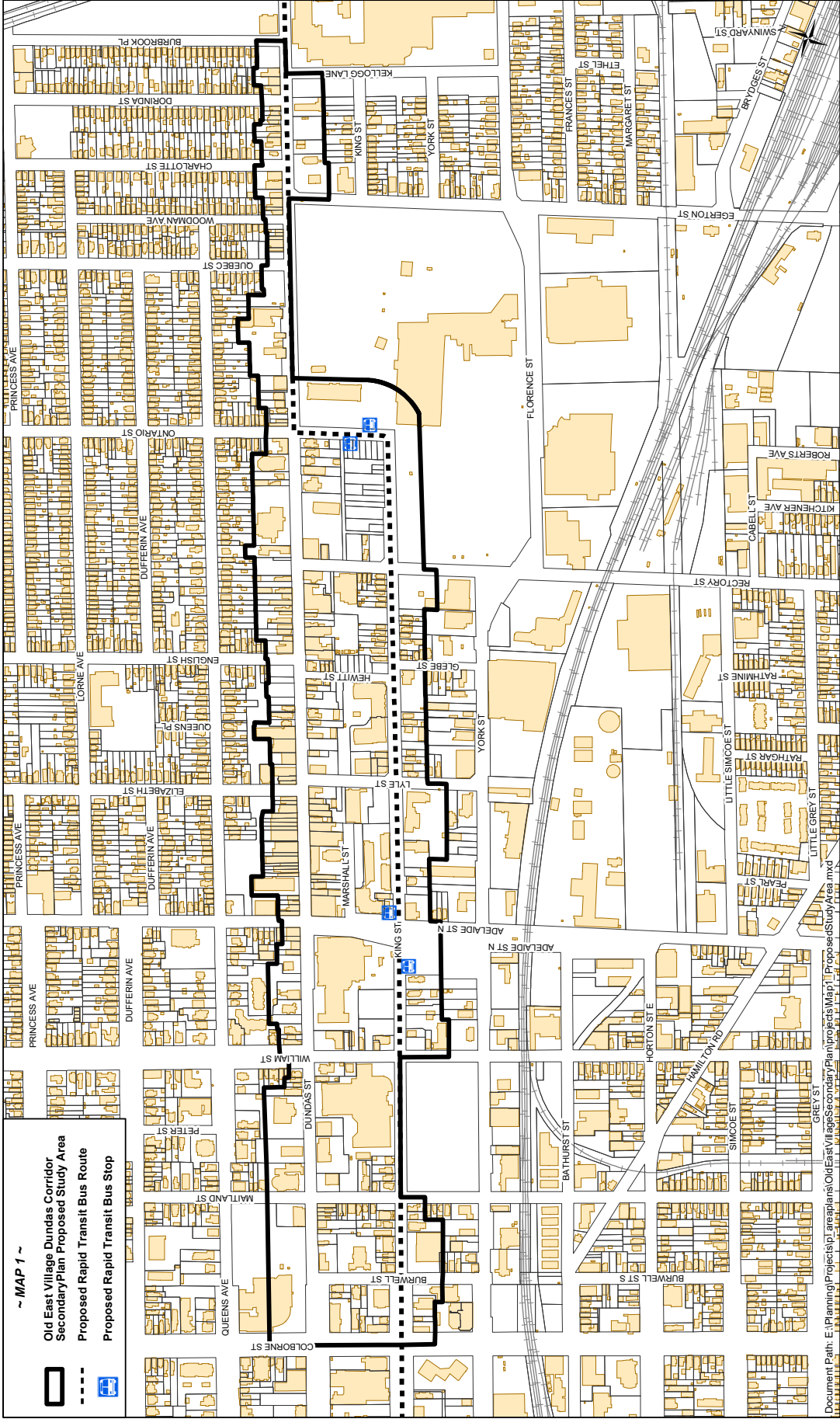
HOW TO GIVE COMMENTS

Please Note: This meeting is a non-statutory public information meeting which the City's Planning Department at times convenes when, in the opinion of the Managing Director, Planning and City Planner, that the community should have a further opportunity to obtain information regarding a planning application.

There will be a future statutory public participation meeting required under the Planning Act, held at the Planning and Environment Committee, which will provide the public with another opportunity to comment on the planning application.



The limits of the east-west bikeway evaluation extend further west to the downtown and consider potential routes north and south of the identified secondary plan study area. Through the evaluation of potential corridors, a number of on-street parking impacts have been identified. The corridors under evaluation can be found on london.ca by searching “downtown bikeway corridor”.
