Murrumbeena to Malvern Flood Mitigation Project

Project site office to be located in reserve between Sydare Avenue and Hyslop Parade.

During the week commencing Monday 16 April 2018 a site office and storage area in the reserve between Sydare Avenue and Hyslop Parade, Malvern East will be established. Preparation works may take place prior to this date.

The site compound (highlighted in blue on map provided) will be in operation for the duration of the project, until mid-2019.

The project's first construction zone (highlighted in orange on the map) will be set up from late April until approximately late August 2018. Part of this work requires crews to undertake sewer bypass pumping. This involves setting up a pump at one manhole which moves sewerage through a pipe to another manhole, allowing a section of the sewer system to be isolated. The pump will need to operate throughout the day and night, whenever there is sewerage in the system to move. There will be some noise associated with this.

The project will remove the existing sewer line because it is blocking the new drain. A new section of sewer will be constructed in a different location and connected into the existing network. There will be no disruption to household services during these works.

Site compound set up

To establish the site compound we will:

- Install temporary fencing and lighting.
- Undertake concrete works for footings and paths.
- Deliver and install site sheds including amenities.
- Create a crushed rock car park and access tracks.
- Remove top soil and store within the site for reinstatement activities in 2019.

The site office will temporarily require the use of a generator until we are able to connect to a main electricity source.

There will be no vegetation removal required for the project site office however, tree removal is required for the construction works along the new stormwater drain alignment.



What will I notice during normal day-to-day site operations?

We are aware that we will be working in your neighbourhood and will do our best to minimise inconvenience to our neighbours during the establishment of the site office, its operation and construction of the new drainage system. However, we recognise that we will be visible and cause an increase in noise and movement in the area.

Work hours: Construction works will take place between 7am and 6pm Monday to Friday, and 7am and 1pm Saturday, however the site office will operate before and after these hours for meetings, tidy up and office work. Additionally, at times, bypass pumping operation will be required to operate 24 hours a day.

Noise: Noise will be generated from workers, trucks and vehicles accessing the site office compound and undertaking works in the adjacent areas.

Traffic: There will be a considerable increase in truck and vehicle movements along Sydare Avenue and Hyslop Parade for delivery of materials and equipment to the site compound and throughout the alignment.

Street parking: In an effort to minimise the size of our site compound, some project team members may park in the street. Please contact us if our street parking location is causing issues for your household.

Dust: Dust will be generated from the earthworks and construction activities. Works and weather conditions will be monitored and water carts and street sweepers will be used when required.

Footpaths: Footpaths will remain open when it is safe to do so. Please follow the signage and instructions.

Public access restrictions: No public access will be allowed in the site compound and construction areas. If a ball or personal item enters our site, please contact us for assistance.

Project update

Once the site compound is set up, construction work will start throughout the project alignment. Works will commence in mid-April and are expected to be completed by mid-2019.

Multiple sites will be operating at the same time to improve the efficiency of the project. In the coming weeks we will distribute notifications and door knock the impacted areas with further information regarding tree removal, changes to property access and traffic flow.
