

Brighton Main Sewer Upgrade

Manhole investigation works November 2017

Melbourne Water is continuing to plan and design works to upgrade the 100 year old Brighton Main Sewer to ensure that the Brighton and Hampton areas continue to receive a reliable sewerage service.

Project overview

The Brighton Main Sewer has been servicing the Brighton and Hampton suburbs of Melbourne since 1907. Inspections of the sewer have revealed that much needed structural rehabilitation is required to both rehabilitate and continue the life of this asset for another 50 years.

What's involved?

Investigation works are planned for late November early December 2017 for approximately seven to ten nights. Works will include traffic management and lifting of manhole covers to facilitate a visual inspection of manholes along the project alignment between Orlando Street, Hampton and North Road, Brighton.

When will these works be conducted (at night)?

To minimise traffic disruptions in and out of the area, works are proposed to be undertaken Sunday night through to Thursday night from 9.30pm through to 7am with no works planned at this point for Saturday or Sunday.

What will I notice during investigations?

- Some lane closures on Beach Road
- Local road closures where manholes are located at intersections
- Restricted access around some Manholes which may impact on residential access
- Localised parking restrictions
- Some light spillage
- Reduced access and localised temporary closures to some footpaths/ bike trail
- It is anticipated that there will be some noise and odour impacts from these works noting that there will not be any heavy construction machinery or equipment involved in the investigations phase.

The project team will make every effort to minimise the impact of these essential works on the local community and the environment. Further construction updates to follow when more information is available.
