

Heavy Vehicle National Law Review Workshop: Building blocks

Brisbane

Monday, 2 December 2019

The third Heavy Vehicle National Law Review policy solutions workshop took place in Brisbane on Monday 2nd December 2019.

More than 30 industry and government stakeholders participated in discussions on fundamentals to inform options for inclusion in the regulation impact statement (RIS) due for release in early 2020.

A panel of experts offered their perspectives on important considerations for the RIS, to stimulate thinking on the key elements for inclusion. The NTC put forward potential areas for assessment; these areas were the subject of morning and afternoon workshop sessions.
