Have your say on proposed planning provision changes to 795 Princes Highway, Pakenham, VIC 3810

The supermarket chain Kaufland Australia Pty Ltd has asked for the planning provisions that apply to 795 Princes Highway, Pakenham, VIC 3810, to be changed so that it can build a supermarket on the site, including packaged liquor sales, several speciality shops and car parking.

The Minister for Planning has appointed an advisory committee to consider Kaufland's proposal to develop supermarkets in various locations around Victoria. The advisory committee will consider the planning merits of the proposal for a supermarket in Pakenham and will provide recommendations on whether the proposed changes to the planning scheme are suitable.

Site details

The site is on the northern side of the Princes Highway and east of Thewlis Road. Access is proposed from both Princes Highway and Thewlis Road.

What is proposed to change?

Under the proposal, the Cardinia Planning Scheme would be amended by applying specific controls to the site and inserting an incorporated document into the schedules to Clauses 45.12 and 72.04. The incorporated document will set out the conditions that will apply to the use and development of the site.

The proposal includes:

- 3,781 square metres of supermarket floor area
- 319 square metres bottle shop floor area
- Mall and food hall and other retail tenancies
- A total of 415 car parking spaces
- 26 bicycle spaces
- Signage and loading bay facilities
- The proposed single storey building has a height of 8.9 metres, with a feature parapet height of about 11 metres.

What is the advisory committee?

The Kaufland Stores in Victoria Advisory Committee comprises independent experts in statutory and strategic planning, retail planning analysis, urban design and traffic and transport planning.

The purpose of the advisory committee is to provide a consistent, transparent and timely process for the consideration of the proposed development and use, and changes to planning provisions.

What will the advisory committee do?

The advisory committee will consider the proposal and any submissions it receives.

Have your say – make a submission

You are invited to make a submission to the advisory committee on the proposed planning provision changes.

Submissions must be directed to the advisory committee at engage.vic.gov.au/kaufland-advisory-committee and can address any matter you consider relevant, including whether you support or object to the proposal.

All submissions must state the name and address of the person making the submission and will be treated as public documents.

Written submissions will be accepted by post if internet access is not available. Written submissions must be accompanied by a completed and signed submissions coversheet. Please call (03) 8392 5123 to request the coversheet.

Can I make a presentation at the public hearing?

You can also make a verbal presentation at the public hearing to be held by the advisory committee. If you would like to do this, you must first make a written submission and complete the relevant section of the online form.

The advisory committee will hold a short separate hearing, called a Directions Hearing, before the main hearing after the exhibition period has finished. This hearing will address organisational and other matters, such as when parties will exchange information and the scheduling of hearing submissions, which will be finalised after this hearing.

How can I find out about the final outcome?

The Minister for Planning will consider the advisory committee's recommendations and will make the final decision on the proposed changes to the planning provisions for the site.

The Minister will advise the council once a decision has been made.
