#### Comment

Due to the plant out program of the Park I am experiencing an explosion of Kangaroos moving from the Park to my property and house yard. I can have at any given time (night) up to 25 Roos eating my pasture, and drinking from my dam not discounting several wombats. As soon as we move into the colder weather I have not enough pasture to support my own stock, let alone the number of Roos and wombats. I find that the breeding up of the native animals may be commendable ,but they are moving out of the Park to get to feed , open space and sun light. I am currently spending around \$1000 for feed per Year. How much a year do those that live in Metropolitan Cities or even Regional Towns contribute to this over breeding program? The National Park never has any money to do any thing , so I have been told ,while they oversee the park from their office. Pre the overplanting and over breeding we all lived compatibly. The Roos now break the top wires on the fence continuously , and the wombats dig holes under the fence opening up an escape route for the sheep ,looking for food. Its fast becoming unpleasant living next to this National park that has no relationship with their neighbouring properties owners. Not to mention the Fire hazards, that have been created.
