Before the Hearing

Opening submissions:

Proponent:

1. The Proponent must circulate a summary response to the Request for Further Information Report (Document 45, 16 September 2020) by **12noon on Friday 25 September 2020** (as far as is practicable). All documents will be uploaded to <https://engage.vic.gov.au/crib-point-IAC>
2. It must circulate its opening Part A submission by **12noon on Friday 9 October 2020** that includes a response to the Terms of Reference including:
 - a) An outline of the background, development and key elements of the Project and EES.
 - b) Its identification of key issues to be resolved.
 - c) Provide advice on whether Environment Performance Requirements (EPR) with outcomes that can be measured will be provided and in what form.

Note: The Proponent's Part A submission will be taken as read by the IAC at the Hearing. The Proponent should allow time for questions about its Part A submission by the IAC on Day 1.

3. The Proponent must provide as a separate report, a response to the key issues raised by all submissions. In doing that work, each key issue needs to be grouped and summarised, with clear recommendations about if and how these issues can be resolved. Due to the number of submissions, the IAC has not picked out particular submissions that highlight what it sees as key issues, but it expects the Proponent will do that as part of its response. This summary must be provided to Planning Panels Victoria by **12 noon on Friday 9 October 2020**.
4. The Proponent must maintain a running sheet of recommendations made by various parties to the Mitigation Measures/EPR throughout the Hearing, even if they do not agree with the relevant suggestions made.

Opening submissions:

5. The Proponent, Minister for Planning (DELWP), Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change (DELWP), Environment Protection Authority, Mornington Peninsula and Bass Coast Shire Councils, Cardinia Shire Council, Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation, Environment Victoria/Save Westernport/Victorian National Parks Association must file a brief written opening submission by **12.00 noon on Friday 9 October 2020** if they wish to make such an opening submission on Days 1 and 2 in accordance with the following timeframes:

Day 1:

- a) Proponent – one day

Day 2:

- b) Minister for Planning (DELWP) – 15 minutes
- c) Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change (DELWP) – 15 minutes
- d) Environment Protection Authority – 30 minutes
- e) Mornington Peninsula and Bass Coast Shire Councils – 90 minutes

- f) Cardinia Shire Council – 30 minutes
 - g) Bunurong Land Council Aboriginal Corporation – 30 minutes
 - h) Environment Victoria/Save Westernport/Victorian National Parks Association – 60 minutes
6. The Minister of Energy, Environment and Climate Change through DELWP must provide a summary of the relevant issues arising from submissions about the pipeline. This summary must be provided to Planning Panels Victoria by **12noon on Friday 9 October 2020**.

Port of Hastings

7. In its submission on 15 October 2020, the Port of Hastings Development Authority must provide the following information that summarises:
- shipping movements within the Port of Hastings over the past 10 years, including shipping numbers and types, typical vessel dimensions, and duration and location of berthing
 - projections about future shipping numbers, types and sizes
 - the typical number, frequency, duration and location of ships at off-shore anchorage within the Port of Hastings and Western Port Bay
 - any significant committed, planned or projected use and development proposals associated with the Crib Point Jetty or the broader port area
 - dimensions of the Crib Point Jetty, including the height above high tide of existing jetty infrastructure.

Environment Protection Authority

8. In its submission on 18 November 2020, the EPA must summarise the relevance of Clauses 12, 21, 22 (3)(c), 23 and 25 (a) of SEPP (Waters) to the application by the Proponent for a wastewater discharge to Western Port Bay, deemed an area of high conservation value as described in Schedule 5 of SEPP (Waters).

Expert witness reports

9. All expert witness reports must:
- a) comply with the *PPV Guide to Expert Evidence* (April 2019) (<https://www.planning.vic.gov.au/panels-and-committees/planning-panel-guides>)
 - b) refer to any individual submitter by their submission number, not their name
 - c) be provided to the IAC (only) as an unlocked document
 - d) provide a declaration at the time of giving evidence in accordance with the *PPV Direction for witnesses providing expert evidence through remote conferencing* (https://www.planning.vic.gov.au/data/assets/pdf_file/0030/489117/G11-Expert-witness-declaration-for-video-conferencing.pdf)
10. The Proponent must file its expert witness reports with Planning Panels Victoria by **12.00noon on Friday 25 September 2020**.
11. All other expert witness reports must be filed with Planning Panels Victoria by **12.00noon on Friday 2 October 2020**.
12. ‘Like’ witnesses may file a response to ‘like’ evidence (that is, within the same area of expertise) with Planning Panels Victoria by **12noon on Friday 9 October 2020**.

Confidential submissions

13. The IAC received one submission which requested confidentiality, and this was granted (Submission 70).
14. The IAC received a request that part of another submission (487) be heard in confidence, this has been granted and will be scheduled in Part 4 of the Hearings at a time to be determined.

Presentation of expert evidence at the Hearing

15. The IAC (and other interested parties) will have read the evidence and submissions before they are to be presented and it will only be necessary for witnesses to summarise key points. The IAC does not want long sessions of evidence-in-chief where witnesses read their reports verbatim, rather they must articulate and summarise key issues.
16. The IAC directs witnesses limit their evidence-in-chief to 30 to 45 minutes, unless the IAC otherwise directs or allows. Summary statements in the form of PowerPoint or a short summary document are acceptable and must be provided to PPV by 2.00pm by the business day before the presentation.

Cross Examination at the Hearing

17. Legally represented parties do not require leave to cross examine. In accordance with the Terms of Reference, the IAC may limit the time for cross examination where in its view this will not cause material detriment to any party or infringe natural justice.
18. Parties who are not legally represented seeking to cross examine experts must advise the IAC at the beginning of introducing each expert and will be permitted at the discretion of the Chair.
19. Discretion will relate to time constraints and whether the topic areas have been sufficiently covered by the IAC or Counsel Assisting, or other parties.
20. No submitter may cross examine an expert if they have not read the expert's entire report, including the EES technical report adopted as part of the expert's evidence; and been present for the entirety of the expert's evidence in the Hearing. As best as it can, the IAC will update the timetable at the end of each day to highlight the next day's proceedings and advise the order in which experts will be called.
21. Repeat questions, statements and submissions will not be permitted.
22. If the IAC has concerns about the direction of the cross-examination it will not hesitate to request clarification of where it is going. Cross-examination should not be pursued for its own sake, but only where it would be of genuine assistance to the IAC. It will limit cross-examination if it is not to the benefit of the IAC.
23. When cross examining a witness, questions are put to the witness (not the Proponent or any other party). These might be questions about how the witness formed a particular view, what assumptions the witness based their opinions on, or how they verified any facts they have based their opinions on.
24. Cross examination is not an opportunity to argue with the witness. The IAC respects that submitters may have a different view to the witness. If it is a matter of a difference of opinion, you can explain why you have a different opinion when you make your submissions. Cross examination must be respectful, and productive. It must be about the matters that are before the IAC. Witnesses must not be badgered or repeat questions asked. If the IAC has concerns about the direction of the cross-examination, it will intervene.
25. At the beginning of the calling of each expert, the IAC will be asking which parties or submitters intend to undertake cross examination and the time requested. This is so that preparation for such is undertaken in a thoughtful and orderly manner. All parties and submitters need to prepare questions, and not just think of a question randomly as the expert is giving evidence. That approach is not helpful to the IAC.
26. Counsel Assisting is available to assist unrepresented submitters with how to frame questions if required and he can be contacted at jasonkane@vicbar.com.au. Any correspondence must include your name, submission number and contact details and must include the particular

request for which you are seeking assistance. Any requests must be provided to Mr Kane at least three business days prior to the expert witness being called.

IAC's technical experts

27. The IAC has engaged three experts to give it advice on technical aspects of the Project. The written advice will be made publicly available.
28. The IAC's experts will be present for the presentation of relevant expert evidence in the Hearing (subject to availability), including assisting the IAC's Counsel Assisting with questions for cross examination.
29. At the IAC's discretion, the IAC's experts may be made available for questioning in the Hearing.
