I wish to inform you that a public meeting should be held to explain the changes to the mine proposal and the included new processing proposal. Issues that will have an effect on the community including noise, vibrations, lighting and traffic should be discussed and presented to the Community with supporting relevant data.

Questions raised with the Centrifuge proposal include and are not limited to:

-Will centrifuges be able to process the volumes required to make the mine viable?
-Our business must provide a safe work place environment for our employees, can I be guaranteed that noise, dust, and vibration from the mine site will not impact my workers and my horticultural business.
-Will the increase in flocculants used and accumulation of flocculants impact on the water table, waterways, river and environment?
-More direct and indirect jobs would be created if the water required for the mine was used by the horticultural industries.
-Will depositing tailings "Cake" from the centrifuge into the mine void allow permeable layers within the soil profiles.
-The centrifuge option does not substantially enough reduce the required volumes of water for the mine proposal.
