

To the Advisory Panel Wild Life, On 3 April 2018 Premier Daniel Andrews and Lisa Neville Minister for Water. I emailed to them both the following.

> More Kangaroos are found closer to populated areas. Melbourne Water has been NEGLIGENT not securing the boundary fencing keeping the Kangaroos in the reserve. I NOW HAVE A HUGE COST TO RE-FENCE MY PROPERTY AND TITLE BOUNDARY.

>> Dear sir, Advisory Panel Wild Life, My property joins the Cardinia

>> Creek and the Cardinia Melbourne Water Reserve. (15 Billaroy road Upper Beaconsfield. ) My property PIC 3CACH576 for the purpose of Grazing Cattle.

>> We are over run with Kangaroos, my fencers have been damaged. All stock have been removed due to the damage.

>> In 2017 Tom Thuys from the delwp inspected my property we counted aprox 40 plus Kangaroos in and around the creek flats.

>> I received a permit to cull a number but that was a failure.

>> I have contacted Melbourne Water to have them fix the cyclone fencing to stop the Kangaroos from getting under the fence and out from the reserve, that failed also.

>> THE IMPACT OF KANGAROOS HAS STOPED ALL GRAZING AND HAY CUTTING ON MY PROPERTY. I HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO GENERATE ANY INCOME.

>> WHO SHOULD PAY FOR MY LOSE OF INCOME THIS HAS GONE ON FOR MANNY YEARS.

I WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE CARDINIA CREEK RESERVE FULLY CYCLONE FENCED OFF AND PROPERLY MAINTAINED TO KEEP THE KANGAROOS FROM PRIVATE GRAZING LAND AND PUBLIC ROADS.

THE RESPONSIBILITY WITH IN THE CYCLONE FENCE RESERVE SHOULD BE WITH MELBOURNE WATER.

THE RESPONSIBILITY OUT SIDE THE RESERVE CYCLONE FENCE SHOUD BE WITH DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT, LAND, WATER, AND PLANNING.
