

## Get involved, have your say about Victoria's renting laws

The Victorian Government's *Plan for Fairer, Safer Housing* outlined a vision for ensuring that all Victorians have access to safe, secure and affordable housing.

As part of this plan, the government is undertaking a comprehensive, evidence-based review of the *Residential Tenancies Act 1997* to ensure it provides a fair balance between the rights and responsibilities of tenants and landlords now and in the future.

The Residential Tenancies Act is the main source of consumer protection for Victorians living in rental housing, while also outlining the rights and obligations of landlords and agents.

Since it was introduced, there have been many changes, both in the rental market itself, and in the characteristics, needs and expectations of tenants and landlords.

An increasing number of long-term tenants, those who have rented continuously for over 10 years, are either older people on fixed incomes, or families with children, for whom stability is important.

The reasons why people become and remain landlords have also changed significantly, with rental property becoming an important investment and a key feature of many people's retirement plans.

The review will include:

- in June 2015, the release of a consultation paper, *Laying the Groundwork*, outlining the Victorian rental market and seeking public comment on the effects of different trends in the sector. - over the second half of 2015, public consultation on a series of issues papers exploring a broad spectrum of rental housing issues, while also drawing on submissions on the *Laying the Groundwork* paper
- a public options paper in early to mid-2016, outlining the outcomes of the public consultation for final discussion, with the aim of developing reform proposals for introduction into the Victorian Parliament in 2017.

It is anticipated that the review will be completed by early to mid-2018.

## FAQs

### What will the review cover?

The review is broad-based and encompass wide-ranging themes, such as:

- security of tenancies ("security of tenure") and the viability of longer term leasing;
- protections for people who are older, living with disabilities, and who live in caravan parks and residential parks;
- issues arising before, during, and at the end of, a tenancy;
- standards of property maintenance; and
- the ability of tenants and landlords to manage their relationship and resolve problems that arise.

It is anticipated that these themes will capture issues that come up in the course of public consultation on the paper, *Laying the Groundwork*, released during the first phase of the review.

### **How can I get updates about the progress of the review or other Fairer Safer Housing initiatives?**
