# SAFETY MESSAGE

## Road safety warning for local drivers ahead of busy Easter holiday period

Police are urging locals to play their part in community safety with a clear message ahead of changing conditions and increased traffic over the Easter school holidays — “don’t be complacent”.

The warning from Victoria Police comes as

kids return home for two weeks of school holidays ending with the Easter long weekend.

Police expect to see more traffic as holiday makers take advantage of the break this month.

While there have been 77 deaths on Victoria's roads so far this year, over half on

regional roads, none have happened in the Goldfields PSA.

Zero deaths, to Road Policing Assistant Commissioner Glenn Weir, is where it should be.

“The only acceptable number of deaths on our roads is zero, which is why we cannot

afford to be complacent as we head into April,” he said.

“It doesn’t matter whether you are driving close to home on familiar local roads, or travelling further away, the risk of road trauma is always present.”

## Live4Life launch latest crew

Live4Life Central Goldfields hosted their annual crew launch last Thursday morning at Highview College, inducting this year's theme and five new members.

Seven inspirational year nine crew members Ella, Connor, Felicity, Kadyn, Georgina, Ryan and Matilda, delivered an engaging presentation to year eight students and teaching staff.

Ella and Connor were two members who pioneered Highview's first ever Live4Life crew last year, and will be mentoring new members this year.

The crew introduced the Live4Life model including Teen Mental Health First Aid which will be delivered to all year eight and ten students as well as teachers and community members.

The crew also unveiled their mental health theme - 'If you're feeling sorrow, look for a better tomorrow'.

Their tagline, 'If in doubt, seek it out', lets people know they don't have to be alone in what they're experiencing and that they can seek out the help of a friend, a trusted adult or a professional.

The ambassadors will run a mental health campaign throughout 2025, and will promote their message to the community and at other schools.

Live4Life Adviser for Central Victoria Kathryn Chai congratulated the newly inducted crew.

"They spoke very well up there, they talked about the mental health message they will be learning, showcasing their crew experiences," she said.

Ms Chai said the crew advocate mental health awareness to younger students to encourage those who may be passionate.

"It means the year eights can think I'm passionate about mental health, this is something I could potentially do and step into that space for next year," she said.

While Live4Life has now expanded to 14 communities, each team tailors their program to suit the needs of the local cohort.

"When we work with young people, we do ask them what do you hope to learn and what do you hope to develop, and we revisit that at the end of the year," Ms Chai said.

Crew member Connor is encouraging other students to take part in the program.

"I love to get involved and helping

out. I'm just doing my little bit to help. I love the social aspect of it, it's a great way to socialise and you meet a lot of great people. I 110 percent recommend it to others," he said.

Fellow Life4Life crew member Ella agrees.

"I looked it up and found it was a really good program. Our confidence really sky rockets, just by getting to meet everyone and spreading our messages to the community," she said.

Live4Life Central Goldfields coordinator Shelley Feilding congratulated this year's Live4Life team.

"It's really pleasing to see how well the crew have come together, I'm really proud of the crew for 2025, they are passionate about mental health, and they have done so well in spreading the message today in looking after each other," she said.

The Crew launch was supported by Anglicare KiT Van, Maryborough District Health Service and the Central Goldfields Shire Youth team who all delivered a range of fun and educational activities.

The Live4Life model is about improving the mental health of young people and crew are a key component in spreading positive mental health messaging and raising mental health awareness.

## Roadworks continue

Roadworks remain along the Dunolly-Avoca Road between Woodwards Road and Steven Lane.

Reconstruction along the 900 metre section of road at Mt Hooghly will include stabilising the underlying pavement material to provide future road resilience, road surface sealing, and installation of guard railing over an existing major culvert.

With traffic lights and speed limits of 40 km/h in place, motorists are advised there may be short delays when using this road, as dusty conditions make the work

difficult when drivers exceed this speed.

These limits will be in operation from 7 am to 4 pm.

Drivers have been asked to be patient and considerate of the conditions.

Due to loose stones and dust, there is a speed limit of 60km/h in place out of hours.

This section of road has required maintenance after suffering pavement failure and damage as a result of the 2022 floods.

The works are expected to take four weeks, continuing until April 18.

This reconstruction is funded through the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements (DRFA).

In response to the support Foodbank has given the school, event coordinator Michelle Coburn said this was a unique and fun way to give back to an important cause.

"The Foodbank Foodfight was the

messiest, most fun way to help raise funds for those in need, that is their slogan. Foodbank supports our school community by providing grocery relief to our families as well as supporting our breakfast club," she said.

"As a community, we wanted to give back to a charity who supports not only our little school of 44 students, but who also provides food relief to 2844 front line charities and 3379 other school breakfast programs. Foodbank also makes this fundraiser easy to organise and provides support in the lead up to the event."

As a result, the school raised a higher than expected \$2800, which will go directly to Foodbank.

Following the events success, the school hopes to hold similar fundraisers in the future.

enjoyed the event, I feel they enjoyed sliming the staff the most," Ms Coburn said.

# Locals urged to use service

Alongside World Health Day yesterday, local midwives encourage the community to take advantage of their innovative local care.

Maryborough District Health Service's (MDHS) Midwifery Group Practice (MGP) is nationally recognised due to the continuity of care it offers women from preconception through to early parenting.

Introduced in 2022, the 'Maryborough Model' assigns a primary midwife who will be a point of contact for the family throughout and after the pregnancy.

Executive director of care Debbie Rogers said their low risk maternity service allows women to have continuity of care no matter where they need or choose to give birth.

"We can still support women that need to birth at a higher level service than we can offer. That's not about the skill of our clinicians, that's not about the skill of our midwives, it's about the level of care that the organisation can support," she said.

Anna Bianchi, MGP midwife, said that their model is flexible offering expecting mothers comfort and confidence throughout their pregnancy.

"We're a low risk birthing service but we're an all risk booking service for maternity," she said.

"That makes things much easier for women who may have to birth at Bendigo, may have to birth at Ballarat, because of anticipated needs of their baby or risk factors for themselves — they can still have their local midwife, they can still have local care here which saves them from having to travel."

For Sarah Grundy, endorsed midwife who's involved in the Sexual and Reproductive Advice (SaRA) clinic, the collaboration of this model keeps it safe.

"I think the power of any continuity of care model is the connection to the community, the

connection to the women, and the women's connection to the midwives and the team. We don't work in isolation we work in collaboration with a multidisciplinary team," she said.

MGP midwife Rebecca Smith said they'll often work in partnership with another midwife — seven days on to seven days off.

While women are able to book with their midwife they are also available at all hours for emergencies through to strange questions.

"You can't really plan what will happen in a general day but it encompasses a lot of different aspects of maternity," she said.

"The sense of safety for families as well does come a lot from knowing who's going to be looking after them when they're having their baby. That continuity of care from the start of pregnancy all the way through to the end builds a big sense of trust with the women that we care for."

It's that personal connection, genuine care, that stays with the midwives as well. For Ms Bianchi, like many of her colleagues, she'll "take them home" with her.

"There are always women you just keep with you. There are always births you just keep with you. I think the difference is at MGP they're all special because we do get to know them so well," she said.

It's a relationship of trust which is fostered by time. Something Ms

Grundy believes is particularly important.

"Women and families deserve time. They deserve time to have their worries and concerns listened to. Because then we can better understand them and create a deeper connection and understand their needs and be more responsive to their needs as well," she said.

According to the Australian College of Midwives, which Ms Rogers supported, a continuity of care is the "gold standard" in Australia which leads to better outcomes for mothers and their babies.

"The evidence supports women do better with a known carer and a continuity of care model, and that's what this model is," she said.

But the benefits don't stop at expecting mothers. Ms Bianchi highlighted fathers roles in the pregnancy.

"Dad's are quite often the forgotten element of pregnancy and birth but it's their pregnancy and their birth also," she said.

"Dad's need a lot of support during labour, bless them they really do, so any fears or worries or concerns they have they'll feel safe too because they know the midwife."

Ms Bianchi also said that the continuity of care helps with postpartum depression, specifically among dads, which studies have found that one in 10 experience.

The service will also be expanded as a part of the redevelopment of the Maryborough Hospital. The over \$100 million investment will include two new birthing suites which Ms Rogers hopes will bring more women to MGP.

"We're moving into two beautiful birth rooms in the new hospital at the end of April so we're hoping that increases the number of women that want to have their babies here," she said.

# FARMING

## Baiting against crop damage

### BAITING

A research project is underway to aid Australian grain growers to manage snail and slug damage in crops by optimising bait spreading operations.

Snails and slugs cause substantial crop damage and impose costs on the Australian grains industry estimated at \$43 million annually.

GRDC investment together with substantial in-kind contributions from the Aerial Application Association of Australia (AAAA) and research partners will see around \$450,000 invested in better understanding mollusc bait placement from aircraft and smaller ground rigs.


The research team will be coordinated by Western Australian agricultural research engineer Ben White with technical and practical support from mechanical engineer, Josh Giumelli and Victorian machinery specialist Mark Saunders.

They will work collaboratively with mollusc researchers and the AAAA to conduct the research with a focus on aircraft and operating parameter influences.

Mr White said effective molluscicide baiting is crucial in broadacre cropping systems.

"The project will include testing a range of aircraft types and surveying stakeholders to pinpoint key factors for effective bait distribution," Mr White said.

"Additionally, we'll evaluate a range of common 12-volt ground spreaders to provide a guide on suitable equipment and configurations for smaller spinner spreaders



delivering consistent mollusc baiting outcomes.

"An established test protocol will be adapted to evaluate bait spread performance distribution uniformity."

GRDC manager crop protection — west Georgia Megirian said the project had arisen from feedback via GRDC's National Grower Network (NGN).

"At recent NGN forums, growers across the south coast of WA made it clear that current snail baiting strategies aren't always hitting the mark," Ms Megirian said.

"Snails are a persistent challenge, with control often inconsistent due to difficulties in achieving effective bait coverage and timing.

Application methods and spread accuracy play an important role, and improving these techniques could help reduce crop losses and minimise the need for multiple applications."

Optimising bait timing, integrating cultural and mechanical control methods, and improving the precision of molluscicide bait spreading can enhance snail control, reduce input costs, and minimise grain contamination — helping growers meet market standards.

The project will produce accessible resources detailing the strengths and limitations of different spreader types, along with practical recommendations to improve bait placement and effectiveness for snails.

## Methods of disposal for stock deaths

### LIVESTOCK

Stock deaths occur periodically, and farm managers are responsible for carcass disposal.

Methods of disposal include knackery, rendering services or suitably licensed landfills. If these are not available, alternate biosecure options for use on-farm may include composting or burial.

If on-farm disposal is to be used, then forward planning with appropriate siting, infrastructure and management is critical to minimise any biosecurity, environmental or other risks.

Burying carcasses on the farm may be the most appropriate option depending on the circumstances.

Stringent guidelines apply to appropriate burial sites, so they don't adversely affect the land, surface/ground waters or the air.

Detailed information on setback distances and other requirements can be found in the Victorian

Environment Protection Authority (EPA) document Farm waste management.

The other on-farm option is composting of carcasses. In line with EPA guidance, when the average number of mortalities doesn't exceed one tonne per month, then a composting pile is appropriate.

When mortalities exceed this threshold, bin composting should be considered. Bin composting requires more dedicated infrastructure.

Detailed information on pile and bin composting can be found in the EPA's composting mortalities on farm guidance.

It's important to realise composting is an active process, not a set and forget method. Failing to monitor and follow established composting techniques will result in an increased risk of harm to the land or the environment and a sub-standard final product.

Agriculture Victoria can provide guidance to farmers about on-farm disposal options in consultation with the Environment Protection Authority.

In the event of unusual signs or suspected cases of emergency animal disease, please report them immediately to the Emergency Animal Disease Hotline on 1800 675 888. Early reporting increases the chance of effective control and eradication.

If an emergency animal disease outbreak is declared, Agriculture Victoria is responsible for the destruction and disposal of animal carcasses, including those that can be buried on-farm.

## Decision to stall levy bill has been welcomed

The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) has welcomed the decision to stall the deeply flawed proposed Fire Services Levy Bill and says the reprieve must be used to iron out the fundamental issues facing farmers and regional communities.

VFF president Brett Hosking said while farmers would be breathing a temporary sigh of relief, legitimate concerns still linger regarding the proposed cash-grab.

"This is a step in the right direction. The government tried to push through a flawed tax without consultation and they have clearly failed to secure the numbers," he said.

"I thank those MP's who have demonstrated strong leadership slowing the passage of this new tax

without proper community and stakeholder consultation.

"The VFF's focus will remain on highlighting the very real destruction that this Bill will cause and making sure the government doesn't steamroll through with a reckless decision."

"We have families struggling with skyrocketing costs, and farmers battling drought, bushfires, and rising expenses."

"A cost of living crisis is not the time to introduce an unnecessary new tax. The stalling of the Bill gives us hope and more time, but we must see sweeping changes to the proposal."

Mr Hosking said there would be no letting up on the opposition towards the Bill, despite last week's stall.

"This blatantly wrong tax is wrong today and it will be wrong in the coming days and weeks. The

opposition towards it has been overwhelming and we must keep up the pressure to ensure farmers and regional Victorians aren't hung out to dry," he said.

"Our message to the government couldn't be clearer. Talk to us, consult with us and work collaboratively to get ideas that actually work and don't risk taking a sledgehammer to the livelihoods of hard-working Victorian farmers."

Mr Hosking thanked those passionate VFF members who took the time to write directly to their local MP to voice their opposition as well as those rural focussed organisations who joined with VFF to support our voice.

"We are encouraging you to keep fighting. Keep up the pressure by having your say using the information provided on our website," he said.

the burden of poor management decisions.

The disappearance of rural services is another blow to farmers. From the closure of bank branches to a lack of medical and dental services, rural Australians are increasingly being forced to travel longer distances on deteriorating roads just to access the basics.

The loss of vital infrastructure is leaving our agricultural sector more vulnerable to both economic and logistical pressures.

The policies that seem to punish rural Australians are piling up. The government's decision to end live sheep exports by 2028 will wipe out an industry worth \$84 million annually. The VNI West Project, which would see a 500 KV transmission line installed across pristine farmland, shows the prioritization of metropolitan interests over rural communities.

Adding insult to injury, primary producers, who are also the Service's volunteers, now face a staggering increase in the Fire Services Property Levy, with landholders seeing hikes of over 100 percent some accumulating into the tens of thousands of dollars.


These are just the latest in a series of decisions that have left rural Australians feeling abandoned.

# More to water than it seems

Whose water is the tastiest? That was the question asked last week at the 2025 WIOA Ixom Best Tasting Tap Water competition.

Last Wednesday saw the finest drops of Victorian tap water judged by the Water Industry Operations Association of Australia (WIOA) in a head-to-head water supplier competition.

This "wine tasting" from the tap had judges taste test entries against the Water Tasting Wheel which highlighted colour, clarity, odour, and taste.

Although Lorne WTP Barwon Water was crowned the winner this year WIOA CEO Dean Barnett said the competition is a way of celebrating the efforts of those behind the scenes.

"It's really a celebration of the operations sector within the water industry. What I mean by that is that your average person just has an assumption that they'll turn the tap on and it'll magically appear," he said.

"In the association and industry that we are working in we know that there's an operations crew working behind the scenes every single day of the year, 24 hours a day, and water companies to provide us with that service."

To Mr Barnett the work of tens of thousands of people nationally is often overlooked unless something goes wrong.

"We feel like we're working in a silent industry and the only time anyone pays attention is when they turn the tap on and it doesn't work or they flush the button and it doesn't go away," he said.

It's the complex system behind the scenes that gets water from the source safely to locals homes, it's also the same system that shapes the



subtle differences in the taste of water.

While Central Highlands Water (CHW) didn't leave with a win this year they said there's a complex system behind the scenes that ensures locals' water is safe to drink.

"Our team of water quality specialists supported by our NATA-accredited laboratory conducts continuous monitoring across our supply region. Each year, we perform over 50,000 water quality tests to ensure safety and reliability," they said.

CHW take samples across the water treatment process, from the untreated water through to water coming out of local taps.

"We test water samples from over 600 sites within our water supply network each year, including our storage and service reservoirs," the organisation said.

Mr Barnett said the subtle differences in taste are shaped by each stage of the process. From the source, any minerals associated with the area, and the treatment process.

"It's like a car. There's that many variations of water treatment plants that could slightly effect the water as well. Then it travels down kilometres of pipe to get to somebody's property and then they start drinking it," he said.

"The water industry is an amazing industry and if people have the slightest of interest they should research it a little bit more because there are lots of jobs going on in each water company across the country," he said.

"If you're scratching your head you might say 'yeah, I'll give it a go' and that's exactly what I said around 35 years ago."

CHW's spokesperson added that water colour, taste, odour, and clarity aren't set for an area.

Individual systems may also vary over time when water is sourced from different reservoirs or groundwater bores to ensure security of supply," they said.

While Mr Barnett said he's never tasted bad tap water he was grateful for the teams and many others who play a crucial role in providing safe tap water to locals.

"You can go to a lot of countries where you don't go anywhere near the water and you're scared if you have a shower you'll get a bit in your mouth," he said.

He hopes the long running competition celebrates the efforts of all those behind the scenes — shining a spotlight on them and the opportunity for people to join the team.

"The water industry is an amazing industry and if people have the slightest of interest they should research it a little bit more because there are lots of jobs going on in each water company across the country," he said.

"If you're scratching your head you might say 'yeah, I'll give it a go' and that's exactly what I said around 35 years ago."

## Olivia Butler becomes the Lady Redbacks' first player to play 100 games

"We work on things at training and then on match day we're able to achieve it, we're making our own progress and that's enough of a win for us."
