

Family Ties

ESTABLISHED in 1993 as the Maryborough and District Genealogical Society, the Maryborough Family History group is run by a small group of dedicated volunteers passionate about keeping local history alive

Working from a resource room in the Community Hub, the group gather every Wednesday afternoon to sort through photos, news reports and official records to help others discover their own family history.

Club secretary Helen Ritchie and treasurer Barb Humphrey both understand that, while family history is important for individuals, it is also vital to a greater understanding of the factors that shaped society.

"Without families there is no history – the two overlap," Barb said.

"Church records and so on can be a good source of information with the marriages, baptisms and deaths. But they don't tell the whole story."

Speaking to the women it is clear the research involves much more than simply uncovering records. As Helen explained, this is particularly true for women on the goldfields, whose stories and experiences were often forgotten.

"I did some research for a lady whose great grandmother came from Timor; we found in an 1894 archive of *The Maryborough and Dunolly Advertiser*, her great grandmother being molested as a young child," Helen said.

"A few years later in 1898 she was picked up for prostitution at the railway station. It



turned out this woman wasn't her great grandmother at all; she had adopted a daughter and no one knew. Often in those days there were no records kept of some events: a woman might work as the maid who got pregnant to the master of the house and give the baby to someone who could care for it."

With many years of experience, the Family History Group knows a thing or two about the common pitfalls for budding genealogists. Barb encourages anyone interested in finding out more to contact the group, who can help them on their journey.

"The first rule of family history is to start with yourself and work backwards," Barb said.

"A lot of people just get on ancestory.com and think 'oh, here's our surname, this must be right because it's all on the website." But a lot of times you find it's not. You can have 12 different people with the same name, or names or spelling have change over time for various reasons.

"We are here to make sure you're not barking up the wrong family tree."
