FOR more than 150 years, the Maryborough Highland Gathering has been welcoming the New Year with colour, culture and community spirit.

Originally created by Scottish migrants and businessmen eager to recreate the festive traditions of their homeland, the event has grown into one of Australia's longest-running and most vibrant Highland celebrations.

Each year the Gathering attracts visitors from across the country—athletes, dancers, musicians, and families who simply want to soak up the stirring sound of pipes and drums and enjoy a full day of Scottish-inspired festivities.

The program is designed to offer

something for everyone. The morning begins with the traditional piped band street parade, filling the town with music and ceremony before the day's competitions aet underway.

Athletics events run throughout the day, ranging from fast 70-metre sprints to challenging 1500-metre middle-distance races. Men, women and veteran competitors all take part, with the highlight being the prestigious \$15,000 Max Martin Memorial Maryborough Gift, contested over 120 metres and recognised as one of Australia's notable footraces.

Alongside the track events, spectators can enjoy traditional Highland games and strongman competitions, while two stages host Highland dancing.

Sideshows, rides and kids' activities ensure younger visitors stay entertained. As evening falls, the atmosphere shifts

from competition to celebration.

A free community concert leads into a fireworks display, providing a spectacular finale to a day rich with heritage, athleticism and festive spirit.

The current exhibition, 'Framed and Fired' features a series of paintings by former Maryborough teacher Wesley Lancaster titled 'Borders' in acrylic on canvas. Beautiful ceramic work by Marina Pribaz and Petrus Spronk will compliment this work.

Maryborough's **Central Goldfields Gallery**, set in the historic site of the former fire station, offers an insight in life at the height of the gold rush with two exhibitions – 'Calico Ceilings' and 'The Art of Gold'.

Linda Gallus has engaged with historians and combed the archives to re-imagine and bring to life the stories of women from the gold rush era. Calico Ceilings offers a glimpse into the oftenforgotten lives of the women who endured the harsh conditions of the goldfields.

The Art of Gold reflects a different side



to life on the goldfields. Nine of the 12 pieces, on loan from the National Gallery, date from the mid-19th century goldrush in Central Victoria and are known as goldfields jewellery.


Including earrings, brooches and a locket, these items of jewellery were commissioned by miners, as a mark of their own success and to reflect colonial pride and advancement.



Starry, starry nights

WHETHER you're an avid photographer, an amateur astronomer or simply love looking at the stars, the goldfields region in central Victoria offers some incredible opportunities to star gaze.

Founded in 1922, the Astronomical Society of Victoria boasts more than 2000 members and conducts regular educational and group activities for members and the general public. Graeme Gilmour is a member of the Society's Bendigo branch, and invites people with a interest in astronomy to contact the group while they are in the goldfields.

"We take pride in hosting a variety of exciting events throughout central Victoria, catering to both schools and the wider community," Graeme said.

"One of our popular offerings is the Astronomy for the People (AFTP) program, which includes engaging school star nights and captivating community star nights. These events provide opportunities for people of all ages to explore the night sky alongside our knowledgeable members, using our range of telescopes and binoculars."

Weather permitting, the Bendigo group hold a monthly 'Sidewalk Astronomy' session, where the general public is invited to join with experienced astronomers to learn more about the night sky.

"Sidewalk Astronomy is Bendigo's favourite astronomy event and is held every month next to the Discovery Science and Technology Centre, in Railway Place (opposite Marketplace)," Graeme said.

"Bring the family to see cool astro-stuff through our telescopes, our volunteers will give you a tour of the night sky. Informative family entertainment, and all for a gold coin donation."

Tips for star gazing

Before you go

Check the weather: Make sure the night will be clear and free of clouds.

Pick the right night: The best time is near the new moon as its light is minimal.

Dress warmly: Nights can get chilly, even in summer.

Inform someone: Let others know where you are going and go with others if possible.

Setting up your viewing spot

Get away from lights: Travel to an area with low light pollution.
Find a clear view: Choose a location with a wide-open sky, ideally
on a flat surface.

Let your eyes adjust: Give your eyes 10-20 minutes to adapt to the darkness. Avoid using your phone or any bright lights.

Use a red light: If you need a light source to see, use a red flashlight or a red light on your phone to help maintain your night vision.

What to do while you're there

Use a stargazing app or chart: These tools can help you identify constellations and planets.

Start with your naked eye: Look for the brightest objects first, such as planets.

Consider binoculars or a telescope: Binoculars can be a great starting point, and a telescope will reveal more detail.

Get comfortable: Sit in a reclining chair to relax your neck while looking up for an extended period.

Be patient: Your eyes will continue to adapt, and you will start to see more faint objects the longer you wait.

While taking time out in the bush can provide much-needed relaxation, always be prepared before heading out prospecting, walking, cycling or star adzina.

Snakes are out and about this time of year, so pop in to a camping specialist,

such as Lyal Eales, to pick up a specially prepared snake bite kit.

Although snakes will try to avoid people, sometimes you may disturb a snake and end up being bitten. St John's Ambulance have put together the following steps to follow if you or a companion are bitten:

- · Lay the casualty down and provide reassurance
- · Apply a pressure immobilisation bandage:
- 1/Wrap a broad pressure bandage around the bite as soon as possible
- 2/ Apply a firm heavy elasticised roller bandage just above the fingers or toes and work your way upwards on the limb. Wrap the bandage past the snakebite and as far up the limb as possible
 - 3/ Ensure the bandage is applied firmly without hindering blood circulation
 - 4/ Splint the bandaged limb
 - · Ensure the patient remains still
 - Call triple zero (000) for medical assistance
 - Record the time the bite occurred and when the bandage was applied
 - Wait with the casualty, monitor and record any changes in their condition DO NOT clean the wound or attempt to suck venom from the bite.



Be prepared

BEFORE travelling to the goldfields, make sure you have downloaded the Victorian Emergency App on your phone and adjusted the notifications to your travel plans.


