OVINGHAM LEVEL CROSSING REMOVAL PROJECT

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The Public Transport Projects Alliance (PTP Alliance) is removing the rail level crossing on Torrens Road, Ovingham to improve travel times, connectivity, and safety for all road and rail users. The \$196 million project is jointly funded (50:50) by the Australian and South Australian governments.

Upcoming major works - Sunday, 29 May 2022 to Friday, 10 June 2022

Major works will be carried out continuously from 8.30pm Sunday, 29 May 2022, until 5am Friday, 10 June 2022, weather permitting.

These works will include:

- upgrading the junction of Torrens Road with Churchill Road;
- upgrading the junction of Chief Street and the new Torrens Road bridge; and
- switching traffic onto the new Torrens Road bridge.

Day and night works will be undertaken during this period.

At the completion of this work, traffic will be switched onto the new Torrens Road bridge. Please see the maps over the page for the new traffic arrangement that will be in place from 5am Friday, 10 June 2022.

To safely undertake these works, changed traffic conditions will be in place, including temporary road closures, speed and lane restrictions.

Traffic management and detours

Detours will be in place to direct motorists. Please see the maps over the page for traffic detour information during these major works.

Please plan ahead, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and direction of traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Temporary pedestrian and cyclist changes

The works will require temporary pedestrian and cyclist detours. Please follow the site signage and observe the direction of traffic controllers.

Access to properties

Access to businesses and residential properties will be maintained throughout the works, wherever possible. Advance notice will be provided if there is a need to temporarily restrict driveway access.

Noise and vibration

Trucks, concrete saws, excavators, tippers, concrete pumps, compaction equipment and lighting towers will be used during these works.

Some noise disturbances can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents, as much as practically possible.



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Temporary public transport changes

Public transport services will be temporarily impacted along Torrens Road and Churchill Road.

Adelaide Metro buses will be detoured during the closures. Advance notice signage will be in place at bus stops to advise passengers of the detours.

Rail level crossing removal and road works

The traffic switch to the new Torrens Road bridge enables works to commence on the removal of the rail level crossing and upgrade of the existing Torrens Road.

Works along Torrens Road will commence immediately after the traffic switch **from 5am Friday, 10 June 2022**. The PTP Alliance will work with local businesses and residents to provide updates and manage access.

To safely undertake these road works, various changed traffic conditions will be in place, including speed and lane restrictions. Where required, signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access and/or detours. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.

Torrens Road and Churchill Road detours during major works

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Traffic arrangements from 5am Friday, 10 June 2022 until late 2022









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Continuing works – remainder of May and June 2022

The following activities will continue throughout the remainder of May and June 2022, weather permitting

Construction of the Torrens Road bridge and ramps

Works on the bridge deck and the approach ramps are continuing. This includes concrete works, asphalting, road surface and kerb construction, line marking and painting of finished surfaces.

Upgrade of the Torrens Road junction with Churchill Road and construction of Hayman Street link road

Junction upgrade works are continuing along Torrens Road, between Napier Street and Park Terrace and along Churchill Road, between Torrens Road and Avenue Road (including the Churchill Road service road).

Works are also continuing along Hayman Street to build the new link road.

These works have included asphalting, road surface and kerb construction, line marking and light pole installation.

You may notice some odour which is common when asphalting works are underway.

Common Services Trench and underground stormwater drainage systems

Works continue for:

- installation of the Common Services Trench along Torrens Road, between Exeter Terrace and Fitzroy Terrace; and
- installation of underground stormwater drainage systems in project construction areas and along Torrens Road and Churchill Road.

Ovingham Railway Station

Works to upgrade Ovingham Railway Station are continuing. The station will remain closed until works are completed in late 2022.

Additional new works - remainder of May and June 2022

The following new activities will be undertaken throughout the remainder of May and June 2022, weather permitting

SA Water main relocations

SA Water main relocations will be undertaken along Torrens Road, between Chief Street and Picton Street. The local community near this work have been provided more detail about these activities.

SA Water will provide at least four days advance notice for any temporary planned water outages. For queries about water outages, please call SA Water on **1300 729 283**.

Road surface works

Road surface works will be undertaken along Devonport Terrace and Exeter Terrace. These works will include demolition of existing kerbs and pavement, saw cutting of the road, asphalting and line marking.

You may notice some odour which is common when asphalting works are underway.

Driveway and pathway works

Driveway and pathway works will be undertaken along Torrens Road, between Chief Street and West Street.

These works include remediation of footpaths, removal of existing sections of driveways and construction of new driveways. The project team will work with businesses to manage access.



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Public activity areas and landscaping

Under the new Torrens Road bridge, construction of the plaza and sport courts areas will commence.

Landscaping works within various construction areas, along with mural painting on the piers (bridge supporting columns) and abutment walls (bridge supporting walls), will also commence.

What to expect for works – remainder of May and June 2022

Hours of work

Most of these works, separate to the period of continuous works planned, will be undertaken Monday to Saturday, from 6am to 6pm, however:

- where significant lane and speed restrictions are required, works will be undertaken at night Sunday to Thursday, from 7pm to 6am. Advance notice of works will be provided to properties within close vicinity of the construction area;
- pending supplier availability, concrete pours may commence from 3am, Monday to Saturday; and
- SA Water works will be undertaken at night Sunday to Thursday, from 7pm to 6am.

Pedestrian and cyclist access changes

Some temporary pedestrian and cyclist detours will be in place around the works site as required. Pedestrians and cyclists are advised to follow directional signage. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to the community.

Traffic changes

To safely undertake these works, lane and speed restrictions will be in place along Torrens Road, Churchill Road and intersecting side streets. Local road closures may be required during works and local detours will be in place. Please plan ahead, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site. Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access to businesses and residential properties will be maintained. In the event that access restrictions are necessary, you will be notified in advance by the project team.

There is no change to public transport services.

Increase in vehicle movement and machinery

Construction vehicle movements in the area will increase as trucks deliver and remove materials from the work site. New machinery will also be delivered to site.

The increase of machinery and vehicle movement will be closely monitored and when necessary, dust will be suppressed using water carts. Mud will be managed using street sweepers.

Noise, vibration, odour and light spill

Some noise and vibration disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however, the works will be managed to minimise disruption as much as practically possible.

Concrete saw cutting and compaction of road material will be required for SA Water Main relocations. Rock breaking machinery will be required at times and will only be used up until 10pm, unless otherwise advised.

You may also notice some odour which is common when asphalting works are underway.

Temporary light towers will be used during night works.



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
