PORT DOCK RAILWAY LINE PROJECT



CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

JULY 2023

The South Australian Government has committed \$51 million for the Port Dock Railway Line Project. The Public Transport Projects (PTP) Alliance comprising of McConnell Dowell, Arup and Mott MacDonald, together with the Department for Infrastructure and Transport, will deliver this project.

The project will re-establish the spur line, construct a new train station and bus interchange. It is expected to support 100 full time equivalent jobs per year averaged over the life of the construction period.

Commencement of works

Site compound establishment and preliminary rail reconstruction works will occur from Monday, 31 July 2023, until late October 2023 from 7am to 5pm, Monday to Friday, weather permitting.

Advance notice will be provided to surrounding properties if any Saturday works need to be undertaken.

These works will include:

- installation of temporary fencing to delineate the works area;
- underground service investigations within the rail corridor;
- general construction activities to establish the project site compound and installation of demountable buildings (this facility will be used by the project team for the duration of the project);
- removal of existing rail track and redundant existing rail infrastructure;
- welding of rail;
- earthwork activities for rail construction;
- installation of new ballast, rail and infrastructure; and minor vegetation pruning.

No works will occur in areas that require State Commission Assessment Panel (SCAP) planning approval or the design elements of the plaza and station precinct.

How will these works affect me?

Construction noise

You may hear noise from vehicles and construction equipment, machinery delivery trucks, grinding, cutting of rail, excavation of ballast stones, and use of tamper equipment.

Every effort will be made to minimise disruption to residents during works.

Increase in vehicle movement and machinery

There will be an increase in vehicle movements in the area, as trucks will be delivering materials from the work site.

Noise and vibration

Excavators, tippers, compaction equipment and lighting towers will be used during these works.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however, the works will be managed to minimise disruption as much as practically possible.















Minor traffic changes

To safely undertake these works, traffic controllers and vehicle spotters facilitate access to the works area and site compound. There may be short term delays for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists during these times.

Please take extra care when workers are on site. Observe changed conditions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Public transport changes

There will be no impacts to public transport services during these works.

Pedestrian and cyclist detours

Temporary changes to pedestrian and cyclist access to the Outer Harbor Greenway will be required during these works. To minimise the impact on pedestrians and cyclists, a temporary pedestrian and cyclist path will be provided from the Outer Harbor Greenway from the rear of the South Australian Aviation Museum to the existing museum access road. Refer to the attached map for further information.

Please follow the site signage, observe the direction of traffic controllers when on site and take care when travelling through the area.

Pedestrian and cyclist access between Lipson Street and Bower Crescent, as well as vehicle access from Lipson to the South Australian Aviation Museum, remains unchanged during this period.
