RACE RULES

- WAKA: It is the responsibility of the club wishing to enter to arrange the use of eligible waka. Spray skirts are compulsory. Rudders optional for W1 waka
- SAFETY EQUIPMENT All W6 waka must carry two bailers, sufficient life jackets for all paddlers and two spare paddles
- NOVICE CREWS will have less than one year's paddling experience and may have an experienced steerer and one other experienced paddler; please respect this when entering the novice category.
- COURSE A map of the course will be provided closer to the event. Race officials reserve the right to alter the course to suit conditions.
- DRESS competitors must dress appropriately for cooler conditions, polypropylenes recommended. Competitors will be checked to ensure they are dressed adequately for the conditions.
- SAFETY the race director and officials have absolute control over the event. They have the discretion to withdraw any competitor or waka which in their opinion is or will be endangering their own or others' safety.
- SUPPORT BOATS race organisers will arrange officials and support boats.
