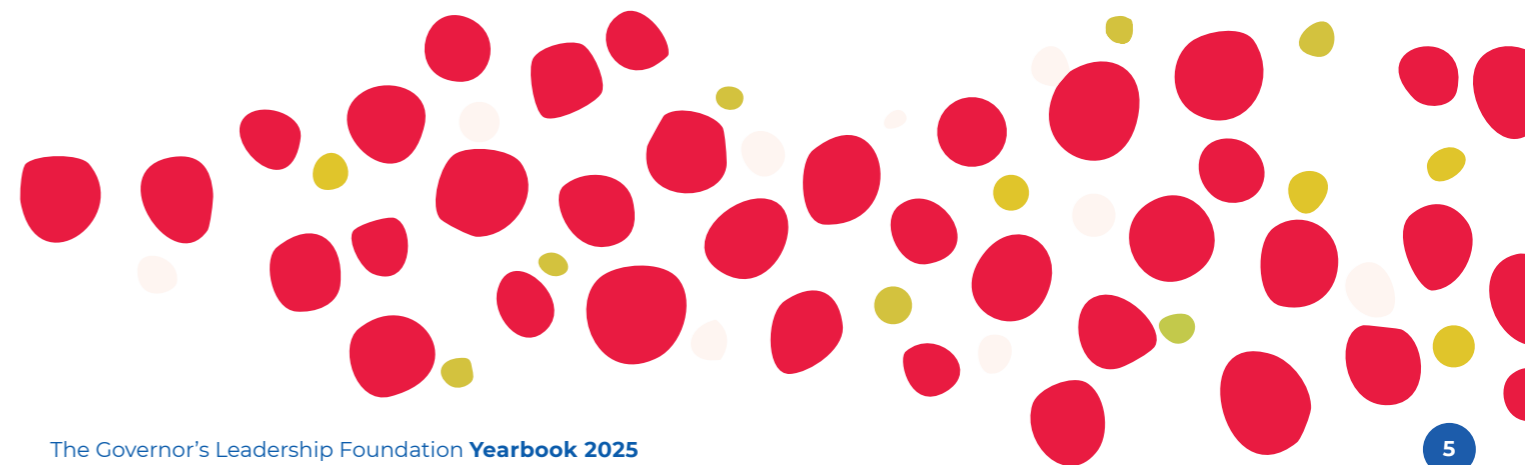

## ABBIE TAYLOR

Director Philanthropy and Corporate Partnerships, Adelaide Festival Centre

James and Diana Ramsay Foundation scholarship recipient.

**Background.** Abbie is a leader in arts philanthropy with more than a decade of experience inspiring generosity in support of cultural institutions. As Director of Philanthropy and Corporate Partnerships at the Adelaide Festival Centre, she has led the establishment of the Foundation's endowment fund, growing it to \$16 million in four years, with a vision to reach \$25 million.

Her strategic focus is on ensuring the Adelaide Festival Centre remains financially sustainable, innovative and artistically vibrant. Abbie has also delivered significant capital campaigns, including fundraising for Westminster School's STEM building and sports pavilion.

**Reflection.** The GLF has been a valuable experience, shaping how I think about strategic leadership and community connection. I've noticed a stronger focus on long-term sustainability and a clearer understanding of how to translate ambitious visions into tangible results.

The program reinforced my commitment to cultivating the next generation of supporters and provided practical frameworks that will accelerate progress towards the \$25 million endowment goal. Personally, it deepened my appreciation for the role of connection in leadership and gave me tools to maintain balance while leading complex, high-impact campaigns.

I leave the GLF with renewed purpose and greater confidence in my ability to deliver lasting impact.



## ALAN BODDY

Dean of Research, UniSA

**Background.** Alan has held research and academic leadership roles in the UK, USA and Australia. Born and educated in London, he completed his undergraduate and postgraduate studies in Pharmacy at the University of Manchester before working at the University of Washington.

He spent more than 20 years in cancer research at Newcastle University in the UK, later moving to Australia to join the University of Sydney in 2014 and UniSA in 2018, where he initially served as Head of the School of Pharmacy. Alan is married with two daughters and enjoys supporting them in sport and music. Outside work, he keeps active through running and swimming, with reading and yoga providing balance.

**Reflection.** The GLF has introduced me to fantastic and inspirational people. I have seen the growth and self-belief develop in so many people who started off uncertainly. I have been challenged and supported in equal measure.

## AMRITHA APARNADAS

Manager, STTARS

Nunn Dimos Foundation and CBB - Keith Fulton Memorial Scholarship recipient.

**Background.** Amritha is a trauma-informed leader with extensive experience across international and Australian community service settings. She has led multidisciplinary teams delivering psychosocial and clinical responses in complex, high-risk environments, including torture and trauma recovery services in offshore detention centres in Nauru and Inverbrackie.

Her work is grounded in human dignity, cultural safety and ethical practice, with deep expertise in torture and refugee trauma, domestic and family violence, sexual assault and chronic pain management. She has worked with organisations including 1800RESPECT, Baptist Care, Mission Australia and Women's Safety Services. In her current role at STTARS, Amritha leads the Communities, Allied Health and Therapeutic Groups team, focusing on community-based trauma responses, integrated service delivery and team wellbeing. She is known for leading with empathy, clarity and calm strength, holding people and purpose at the centre of every system she builds.

**Reflection.** The GLF has been a deeply meaningful and transformative journey. It strengthened my confidence to lead with clarity, courage and authenticity, while staying grounded in compassion and purpose. I deepened my self-awareness and learnt to embrace vulnerability as a strength. The program reinforced the importance of clear boundaries, reflective practice and values-led leadership.

I leave with renewed purpose and a stronger connection to my leadership identity, committed to building resilient teams and contributing to healing and social justice through trauma-informed, community-centred leadership.



## ANDREW RAYMOND

Senior Planning and Policy Officer, Dept. for Environment and Water

**Background.** Andy has 25 years' experience in the environmental sector, leading the resolution of complex land management issues through strategic planning, policy advice and practical management strategies. His work has included community engagement, stakeholder relationship management and coordinating grants and capacity-building initiatives to strengthen community involvement.

For the past five years, Andy has worked as a Policy and Planning Officer with the National Parks and Wildlife Service, developing constructive relationships with key stakeholders and Traditional Owners to deliver management plans for South Australia's national parks. Based in Adelaide, his career across government agencies reflects a long-standing passion for the outdoors and Australia's natural landscapes.

**Reflection.** Participating in the GLF supported significant personal and leadership growth. Connecting with diverse peers and observing values-driven leaders was inspiring. The experience challenged me to embrace discomfort, let go of the need for certainty and recognise vulnerability as a strength. Through feedback, peer coaching and structured reflection, I developed greater self-awareness and a more confident, empathetic leadership style. The Community Action Project stretched me beyond the environmental sector, reinforcing that effective leadership is grounded in clarity of purpose, confident direction and inclusive ownership.

I'm committed to sustaining these practices and creating environments where diverse perspectives are valued and others are empowered to lead.

**Community Involvement.** Member, Seacliff Surf Life Saving Club



**BEN HALL**

*CEO, Barossa Village*

**Background.** Ben is an energetic and values-driven leader whose career spans local government and aged care. As Chief Executive Officer of Barossa Village, a community-owned not-for-profit provider in the Barossa Valley, he is committed to fostering excellence and innovation in care for older Australians.

Guided by his personal mission to “create great places for people,” Ben focuses on empowering his team and building environments where both staff and residents can thrive. Known for his strong sense of stewardship and protection, he is passionate about leading community-facing organisations that create meaningful, people-centred impact.

**Reflection.** When the GLF began, I remember thinking, what have I done? Who are these people? I believed I understood society’s challenges and my role within them. As the program unfolded, the complexity felt overwhelming at times.

With the steady support of mentors and peer coaches, my thinking began to shift. I realised that while I have a responsibility to contribute, society’s burdens are not mine alone to carry.

The GLF was not about tools and techniques. It was about shared learning, deep relationships and honest reflection. I leave with greater calm, thoughtfulness and clarity about the role I can play – not just as a leader, but as a human being.



**CHRISTINA LORENZINI**

*Project Manager, LGA*

**Background.** Christina entered the GLF program with 15 years’ experience across local government, emergency management and environmental health, developing a strong identity as a practical, technically grounded leader. Alongside her public sector career, she also owned and operated her own business for 16 years, bringing commercial insight and resilience to her leadership approach.

**Reflection.** In my current role with the Local Government Association, I am leading a sector-wide WHS reform – work where certainty, structure and delivery have always been my comfort zone. The GLF challenged that mindset.

Through the Community Action Project, I was pushed beyond technical solutions and into adaptive leadership. Working alongside my CAP group taught me the value of sitting with uncertainty, navigating complexity together and recognising how different perspectives strengthen outcomes.

The GLF helped me understand that leadership is not always about having the answers, but about awareness, presence and clarity of purpose.

I leave the program with a deeper understanding of how I want to lead and contribute, and greater clarity about the impact and legacy I hope to create for my community and my family.



**CHRISTINE ECONOMOS**

*Nurse Lead – Cancer Program, CALHN*

**Background.** With nearly 30 years’ experience across complex health settings, Christine’s career spans specialist clinical practice through to backfilling Executive Director of Nursing roles. She brings strong capability in clinical governance, workforce planning, strategic projects and change management. A qualified Critical Care Nurse, Christine holds a Master of Health Service Management.

She is committed to cultivating psychologically safe, culturally responsive environments where staff thrive and consumers feel heard through codesigned approaches. In recent leadership roles, Christine has strengthened workforce capability, redesigned models of care and led major quality, safety and accreditation initiatives. She has guided large multidisciplinary teams through restructure and service redesign, contributing to improved health outcomes across South Australia.

**Reflection.** The GLF has been a profoundly enriching and transformative experience. It deepened my understanding of complex systems and reinforced the importance of leading with curiosity, courage and authenticity.

The diversity within the cohort expanded my thinking and strengthened my appreciation for multiple perspectives. Leading with vulnerability has enabled more authentic connections and created space for others to contribute and innovate.

Through peer mentoring and our Community Action Project, I sharpened my strategic thinking, collaboration and capacity to influence positive change. I leave The GLF with greater self-awareness and renewed commitment to fostering meaningful impact in both my professional and personal life.



**CHRISTINE SCHLOITHE**

*CEO, Music SA*

**Background.** Christine is an experienced executive across the not-for-profit, arts and cultural sectors, with local, national and international experience spanning music, festivals, major events, cultural tourism, performing arts and government. She values authentic professional relationships, community engagement and creative leadership.

As CEO of MusicSA, the peak body for the South Australian music industry, she works with the Board, staff, stakeholders and government to strengthen and promote the local music ecosystem. Christine is also Director and co-owner of Event Rigging Solutions Pty Ltd, a specialist supplier to the event and entertainment industries. She lives in the Adelaide Hills with her partner Alex, two dogs and three alpacas, and unwinds through walking, reading, gardening and following Formula 1.

**Reflection.** As 2025 closes, I am still processing much of what I learnt through the GLF. I am deeply grateful for the opportunity, the exposure to diverse voices and the professional and personal connections formed.

While I entered with a strong grounding in systems and community, the real value for me was in the exchange of perspectives and the exploration of leadership frameworks and paradigms. The GLF sharpened my awareness of leadership responsibility and accountability in an increasingly complex world.

I leave more measured, objective and intentional in my professional relationships – and more confident in trusting my intuition as I step forward as a leader.



**COURTNEY ARTHUR**

*General Manager – People and Culture, Hutt Street Centre*

**Background.** Courtney is General Manager at Hutt Street Centre, a leading homelessness service in South Australia. She brings extensive leadership experience across private equity, FMCG, government, the defence industry and social services, having worked across multiple Australian states and internationally in France.

Her leadership approach centres on building organisational capability, with a strong focus on wellbeing, diversity and inclusion. She is committed to supporting leaders to deliver sustainable outcomes in complex environments.

**Reflection.** This has been a truly transformative year for me. Through the GLF, I've gained deep insights by connecting with leaders across diverse sectors and sharing perspectives on the challenges facing South Australia.

Hosting the cohort at Hutt Street Centre allowed for honest, values-driven conversations about homelessness and social impact, which both challenged and expanded my thinking. The Community Action Project has been particularly meaningful, with genuine potential to create tangible outcomes for the community.

The GLF reinforced the power of cross-sector connection and the impact that comes when leaders show up with curiosity, generosity and a willingness to learn from one another. I leave the program energised and more committed than ever to leading with openness and purpose.



**CRAIG JONES**

**Background.** Craig is Associate Director: Business Incubation at Adelaide University, where he supports entrepreneurs to develop innovations into scalable businesses. His background spans project and risk management, the Olympic Games movement, international relations and innovation ecosystems. He is driven by a passion for building communities around ideas and creating environments where innovation can flourish.

**Reflection.** If I had to sum up this year in one word, it would be connection. Real, human connection – not the polished, professional kind, but the kind that grows when people are willing to show up honestly.

Through unexpected conversations, shared vulnerability and humour, this cohort helped me see my work and communities more clearly. Visiting the Riverland and Adelaide Hills deepened that insight. I met leaders whose presence was steady, local and quietly powerful – people who hold things together simply by showing up.

I realised I'm drawn to that kind of leadership. The villager energy. The community-builder. The person who invests in relationships and shared spaces because it matters.

The GLF clarified the leader I want to keep developing – collaborative, grounded and committed to the slow, meaningful work of building belonging. It helped me see that this is not just something I value, but something I can offer.

I leave with greater clarity about the role I can play in contributing to positive change and would highly recommend the experience to anyone seeking to lead effectively in an ever-changing social landscape.

The program strengthened my confidence, self-awareness and ability to lead with authenticity and intention. I leave grateful for the experience and excited to continue evolving as a leader.

**Reflection.** The GLF 2025 has taught me a great deal about who I am and how I want to lead in a leadership space. I’ve learned that I don’t have to have all the answers or do all the work to be successful.

Throughout the year, I was surrounded by strong, intelligent peers who challenged and inspired me. I became more confident in speaking up, challenging bias and standing firmly in my contribution and identity.

More than anything, I learned that humanity is the thread that keeps us woven together. When people from different cultures, roles and life experiences come together with openness and respect, that’s where the real power sits. That’s where the magic happens.

I began this journey grounded in competence – moving fast, solving problems, carrying responsibility. I leave with a growing capacity to pause, listen and recognise that not all leadership is visible or immediate. I see more clearly how systems move and how I move within them. With that awareness comes choice.

Our CAP group was the heart of the experience. Curiosity was practised when certainty would have been easier. The GLF offered better questions – and the courage to stay with them.

**Background.** Kate is a seasoned arts leader with more than 20 years' experience producing and managing world-class festivals and events. As Senior Program Manager at Adelaide Festival, she brings bold creative visions to life, overseeing program development, stakeholder relationships and the delivery of innovative artistic experiences.

Recognised for her collaborative style and sharp eye for detail, Kate has a talent for managing the many moving parts of large-scale cultural events and crafting programs that connect with diverse audiences. Outside festival season, she draws inspiration from travel, grows vegetables, enjoys live music and values time with family and friends.

**Reflection.** This year reshaped how I understand leadership – not as authority or certainty, but as presence. I arrived with a strong professional identity and was gently, and sometimes uncomfortably, invited to loosen my grip on what I thought I knew.

What emerged was deeper attentiveness to people, systems and the space between intention and impact. The GLF created room to slow down, to listen and to sit with complexity rather than resolve it quickly.

Our Community Action Project will stay with me most. Engaging with Indigenous knowledge and custodianship challenged my understanding of responsibility and relationship. I leave more connected, more open and committed to leading with humility, integrity and a willingness to keep doing the adaptive work, especially when it is unfinished and deeply human.



**KATHRYN PENVER**

**Background.** Kathy has worked in adult education for more than 20 years across multiple sectors, including TAFE SA, and currently leads a nationwide language, literacy and numeracy program that supports people to engage more fully with family, community and employment. She is passionate about creating pathways for individuals to access opportunities they once thought out of reach, helping them build confidence and recognise their strengths.

Deeply committed to equity and inclusion, Kathy's personal connection to Tibet through her husband has shaped her understanding of the generational impacts of colonisation. **Reflection.** The GLF completely shifted how I see leadership. I've learned that leaders don't need all the answers; they create space for clarity and confidence, even in uncertainty.

Systems thinking and adaptive leadership now shape how I approach both work and life. I understand that meaningful results can take years to surface, and that small shifts can ripple across entire systems. Tools like narrative and reflective practice have strengthened how I connect and communicate with impact.

Most importantly, I've changed how I respond to uncertainty. Instead of seeking immediate solutions, I now trust that progress can emerge from thoughtful action. I lead with greater calm, confidence and clarity.

The program pushed me to articulate my leadership philosophy more clearly and reinforced that the complex challenges facing South Australia demand collaboration beyond traditional boundaries. I leave not only believing that diverse voices lead to better outcomes but equipped with the tools to make that happen.

What surprised me most was the centrality of kindness and connection. I expected leadership development to make me harder. Instead, I've embraced an adaptive leadership approach grounded in humanity.

Leah is passionate about driving systemic improvements that deliver quality outcomes with long-term impact. **Reflection.** It has been a privilege to participate in the GLF 2025. I joined seeking to broaden my perspective beyond my usual environment, and the program delivered that in full.

I leave with greater self-awareness and confidence, a clearer sense of how I can contribute, and a valued network of peers committed to making a difference.

A mother of three, Lorraine values family, friendship and community, and brings that relational focus into her leadership practice.

**Reflection.** This year has been a defining experience for me, shaped by an extraordinary cohort and the authentic relationships we built. The trust within the group created space for deep learning and honest reflection.

The GLF strengthened my systems thinking and my comfort with complexity, sharpening how I recognise patterns and influence change. Listening to Uncle Mickey was a turning point, deepening my commitment to learning and contributing to closing the gap. Time in the Riverland grounded my leadership in place and community.

Challenging moments taught me to lead with greater care and honesty. I leave the GLF with deeper self-awareness, enduring relationships and a renewed commitment to lead with courage, always placing community at the centre.



**MADEEHA USMAN**

**Background.** Madeeha is the CEO of Care Assure, an NDIS registered provider committed to building safe, empowering, and genuinely human support systems for people with disability. With a background spanning finance, governance, and community services, Madeeha brings a rare combination of commercial discipline and deep sector understanding to her leadership. Her work is grounded in values driven practice, systems thinking, and a strong belief that leadership is about responsibility, not position.

**Reflection.** Through the Governor's Leadership Foundation program, I have continued to challenge my own assumptions, strengthen my adaptive leadership skills, and explore how leaders can create sustainable impact by influencing systems rather than simply managing them.



**MADELEINE THATCHER**

*Ass. General Manager Mobilong Prison, Dept. for Correctional Services*

**Background.** Having worked in government agencies including the Australian Border Force and the Department for Human Services, Madeleine joined the Department for Correctional Services in 2018 as a Trainee Correctional Officer. Since then, she has progressed through a range of operational and leadership roles, shaping her understanding of people, systems and frontline decision-making.

In 2023, Madeleine was selected for DCS's Tomorrow's Senior Manager program, combining formal learning with senior placements. This led to appointments as Accommodation Manager Secure at Adelaide Women's Prison and General Manager of Cadell Training Centre. In January 2025, she commenced as Assistant General Manager at Mobilong Prison.

**Reflection.** 2025 was a year of profound change. Alongside stepping into a senior leadership role and undertaking the GLF, I also became a mother. I was stretched professionally and personally, but in ways that proved deeply valuable.

I questioned whether leadership development could coexist with pregnancy and early motherhood. What I learned is that growth does not need to pause during life's biggest transitions. With the right support and mindset, career, study and motherhood can sit side by side.

The most powerful lesson was finding my voice. I learned to trust my judgement, speak with clarity and lead with intention. As I step into maternity leave, I do so with greater confidence and a stronger sense of self, ready to return in 2026 with renewed perspective.



**MEMORY RUGUBE**

Senior Economic Analyst, Dept. for Energy and Mining

**Background.** Memory is a senior economist with extensive experience in economic analysis, policy evaluation and sector development across South Africa, New Zealand and Australia. She specialises in economic contribution and cost-benefit analysis, providing evidence-based advice to government and industry.

Since relocating to Adelaide, Memory has moved into a dedicated role within the energy and mining portfolio, supporting South Australia's resources and energy transition agenda. Her work focuses on balancing economic development with social equity. Through the GLF, she has begun exploring how quantitative analysis can sit alongside story and lived experience to inform future leadership and policy practice.

**Reflection.** The GLF was both stretching and deeply rewarding, arriving soon after I migrated to Australia, at a time when I was still questioning whether I belonged. Over the year, I learned that leadership is not only about clarity and having the right answers, but about authenticity, intentional listening and creating space for every voice. I was challenged to sit with ambiguity and to see empathy and vulnerability as strengths.

The Community Action Project brought productive discomfort, sharpening my awareness of the responsibility involved in shaping how stories of poverty are told and heard.

I leave more patient, more curious and more willing to speak imperfectly, understanding that sometimes presence matters more than certainty.



**MICHAEL KROMWYK**

**Background.** Michael is an experienced senior leader with more than 30 years' expertise across commercial, not-for-profit and governance roles. As Deputy CEO at Cara, he is committed to delivering strong outcomes for people living with disability through innovative support models and a focus on sustainability within the NDIS framework.

He entered the disability sector in 2018 with Bedford before serving as Chief Executive Officer of Lutheran Disability Services. Earlier in his career, Michael held senior Marketing, Sales and Business Development roles with leading South Australian organisations including RAA. He is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and contributes to several charity boards and advisory bodies.

**Reflection.** The GLF has been one of the most enriching experiences of my leadership journey. It created space to pause, reflect and ask better questions. I rediscovered curiosity not just as a trait, but as a leadership discipline that drives deeper understanding and innovation. The program strengthened my appreciation for adaptive leadership. Complex challenges cannot be solved with technical fixes alone; they require collaboration, flexibility and courage.

The GLF also expanded my perspective beyond organisational boundaries, prompting me to consider how our work at Cara can contribute to systemic change in disability services. I leave more intentional in how I listen, build trust and create environments where people can thrive.

While the program provided practical tools to navigate complexity, its most powerful lesson was that leadership begins with listening – truly hearing people's stories and perspectives. Exposure to diverse speakers and mentors pushed me to rethink what authentic leadership looks like.

I've become more self-aware, more conscious of bias and more willing to lean into difficult conversations. I leave committed to aligning my work with my values and creating spaces where others feel heard and valued. The GLF has strengthened not only my leadership, but my sense of self.

**Reflection.** The GLF has had a profound impact on my personal growth and professional practice. It created space to reflect on my leadership identity, values and the legacy I hope to contribute.

I was challenged to move beyond transactional leadership habits towards a more empathetic, human-centred approach. I now prioritise active listening, psychological safety and authenticity over authority, and feel more confident engaging in courageous conversations and navigating ambiguity.

Professionally, I operate less as a directive problem-solver and more as a collaborative enabler. Systems thinking and collective intelligence now guide how I approach complex challenges, recognising that sustainable solutions emerge when diverse perspectives are brought together.

The GLF has reshaped not just what I do as a leader, but how and why I do it.

**Reflection.** The GLF began with a powerful reminder of our shared humanity. From the opening retreat, I was inspired by the resilience of the group and confronted my own fears – of not being enough, of being judged, of making myself visible. Throughout the year, I learned to sit with discomfort, listen more deeply and lead with curiosity rather than certainty. The exploration of adaptive leadership, systems thinking, privilege and community resilience challenged me to release perfectionism and instead create space for others to contribute and grow.

I came to see leadership less as having answers and more as holding space – for uncertainty, experimentation and collective sense-making. Courage and humility now sit side by side in my practice.

I leave no longer as a spectator, but willing to step forward, build trust and shape a future grounded in inclusion and possibility.

**Reflection.** Over the past 10 months, I've experienced a meaningful shift in how I see myself as a leader and how I show up each day. The GLF created rare space to pause and reflect beyond the constant operational pressures of community services work. That space allowed me to lead more intentionally, grounding decisions in purpose rather than urgency. I've become clearer about the impact I want to have and more confident in aligning my actions with my values.

The program strengthened my capacity to think systemically, to balance immediate needs with long-term change, and to lead with steadiness in complex environments. I leave the GLF more deliberate, more reflective and more committed to creating preventative, community-centred solutions.
