20% off rego

20 per cent back off your car rego, saving a driver with one car up to \$186 and a family with two cars up to \$372.



Half-price public transport

Half-price fares from June until the end of the year, taking pressure off the pump and saving the average daily commuter more than \$850.

This Budget delivers record total investment in health, more new and upgraded schools, and more investment to keep Victorians safe.



Help with the cost of living:

- Up to 55,000 Get Active Kids vouchers for eligible families
- More free vision tests and glasses for kids who need them
- More affordable school uniforms
- Free Kinder, saving up to \$2,700 per child each year



Making it easier to get healthcare:

- More planned surgeries and specialist appointments for kids
- Operating free Urgent Care Clinics
- Boosting maternity care in the western suburbs
- Opening and operating more hospitals



Delivering quality public education:

- Building 4 new schools and campuses
- Upgrading 31 schools
- Building up to 22 new kindergartens
- Funding 3 TAFE Centres of Excellence



Keeping communities safe:

- Recruiting up to 200 police reservists for desk duties, freeing up frontline police
- 50 more protective services officers for the transport network
- Violence Reduction Unit to stop crime before it starts
