

Admission Criteria for Patients to Alternate Care Site (ACS) at National Orange Show (NOS)

San Bernardino County COVID-19 Emergency Response

In order to maximize the utility of San Bernardino County Alternative Care Sites (ACS) and reduce the likelihood of complications requiring transport to the hospital, <u>ALL</u> of the following criteria must be met by patients transferred to the National Orange Show facility:

- 1. Must have a medical record number (MR)
- 2. Must have *at least* supply of 5 days of all medications and supplies for wound care, tube feeding, or other chronic care needs
- 3. Must have a face sheet
- 4. Must have a medical discharge summary
- 5. Sending hospital must be willing to accept patient as capacity allows re-admission directly or to ED for significant deterioration of patient beyond the ACS capacity to treat
- 6. Sending hospital must accept re-admission of patient when State of Emergency has ended, if patient has not been discharged from the ACS

The following patients will be **EXCLUDED** from admission to San Bernardino County Orange Show ACS:

- 1. Requiring >4 L/m of supplemental oxygen to maintain SpO2 > or = 92% at rest
- 2. COVID-19 symptoms began <14 days ago (for non-COVID medical treatment area)
- 3. Respiratory rate >24 or significantly increased work of breathing
- 4. Blood pressure or heart rate unstable in the last 72 hours
- 5. Fever >100.4 or antipyretic administered in the last 72 hours (for non-COVID medical treatment area)
- 6. Laboratory evaluations worsening at time of transfer (e.g. worsening troponin, lactate, renal function, etc.)
- 7. Needs more than minimal assistance to perform activities of daily living (ADLs)
- 8. Needs more than minimal assistance with ambulation
- 9. Is less than 18 years old
- 10. Weight greater than 300 lbs/136 kg due to site cot size/load capacity
- 11. Has an acute medical condition or complaint that requires additional workup
- 12. Patient has acute mental illness, including acute suicidal or homicidal ideation, psychosis, or severe behavioral disturbance
- 13. Requires vital signs to be checked more frequently than every 4 hours
- 14. Requires nursing checks more frequently than every 4 hours
- 15. Less than 2 days post-operative for surgical patients
- 16. NPO status; if on chronic tube feeding, patient must come with all necessary supplies and formula, and be able to feed themselves or with minimal assistance
- 17. One-on-one nursing requirement

- 18. Airborne, droplet, or contact isolation for anything other than COVID-19
- 19. Receives nebulizer treatments
- 20. Acute need for positive airway pressure
- 21. Chest tube, arterial line, or central line in place (PICC lines are acceptable)
- 22. Requires continuous IV infusions or fluids
- 23. Currently requires or uses IV narcotics
- 24. Requires dialysis
- 25. Requires telemetry monitoring
- 26. Wound care beyond simple daily dressing change
